
# The Acts of the Apostles

Lesson 1: Forty Days Plus Ten


Acts 1:1-26



The book of Acts begins with a reference to another book written by the same author:



- The former treatise have I made,
  O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both to do and teach,
- <sup>2</sup> Until the day in which he was taken up, after that he through the Holy Ghost had given commandments unto the apostles whom he had chosen:



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  O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both to do and teach,
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"The former treatise" is the Gospel According to Luke.

Luke also wrote the book of Acts.

The Gospel Of Luke ends with the Ascension of Christ. This is where the book of Acts begins.

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
#### Luke 24:50-53

- <sup>53</sup> And were continually in the temple, praising and blessing God. Amen.


## Theophilus means "friend of God". The identity of this person is unknown.

Luke also uses this word in his gospel, and gives his qualifications as a historian.



#### Luke 1:1-4

- <sup>1</sup> Forasmuch as many have taken in hand to set forth in order a declaration of those things which are most surely believed among us,
- <sup>2</sup> Even as they delivered them unto us, which from the beginning were eyewitnesses, and ministers of the word;
- <sup>3</sup> It seemed good to me also, having had perfect understanding of all things from the very first, to write unto thee in order, most excellent Theophilus,
- <sup>4</sup> That thou mightest know the certainty of those things, wherein thou hast been instructed.




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
## Why was Luke qualified to write these books?

- 1. He was an eyewitness of Christ's ministry on earth from the start.
- 2. He was a minister of the word.
- 3. He had "perfect understanding" of these things, something that could only come by the Spirit of God.

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
### Another cross-reference in Luke's gospel:





This was a good question, considering the angel's prophecy to Mary:






#### Luke 1:32-33


- <sup>32</sup> He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David:
- <sup>33</sup> And he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end.

Jesus did not answer their question, but instead he spoke more about the promise of the Father.



## This was a big change in instruction from just a short time before!



#### Matthew 10:5-6

- <sup>5</sup> These twelve Jesus sent forth, and commanded them, saying, Go not into the way of the Gentiles, and into *any* city of the Samaritans enter ye not:
- <sup>6</sup> But go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.

# From Smith's Bible Dictionary:

"The Law as regards travel on the Sabbath is found in Exodus 16:29: Let no man go out of his place on the seventh day.



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As some departure from a man's own place was unavoidable, it was thought necessary to determine the allowable amount, which was fixed at 2000 paces [about 2/3 mile] from the wall of the city."




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
# The city wall of Jerusalem

The second part of Chapter 1 -- the 10 days from the ascension to the day of Pentecost – tells of finding a replacement for Judas.




#### Acts 1:13-14

- <sup>13</sup> And when they were come in, they went up into an upper room, where abode both Peter, and James, and John, and Andrew, Philip, and Thomas, Bartholomew, and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus, and Simon Zelotes, and Judas the brother of James.
- <sup>14</sup> These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication, with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brethren.




#### Acts 1:15-17

- <sup>15</sup> And in those days Peter stood up in the midst of the disciples, and said, (the number of names together were about an hundred and twenty,)

- <sup>17</sup> For he was numbered with us, and had obtained part of this ministry.




#### Acts 1:18-19

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# A 'bishoprick' is a place of authority held by an elder.

## There was one qualification for joining the apostles:

#### Acts 1:21-22

- <sup>21</sup> Wherefore of these men which have companied with us all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us,
- <sup>22</sup> Beginning from the baptism of John, unto that same day that he was taken up from us, must one be ordained to be a witness with us of his resurrection.



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#### Acts 1:21-22


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
He must have been with Jesus from his baptism to his resurrection.

#### Acts 1:23-25

- <sup>23</sup> And they appointed two, Joseph called Barsabas, who was surnamed Justus, and Matthias.
- <sup>24</sup> And they prayed, and said, Thou, Lord, which knowest the hearts of all *men*, shew whether of these two thou hast chosen,
- <sup>25</sup> That he may take part of this ministry and apostleship, from which Judas by transgression fell, that he might go to his own place.




# Acts 1:26 And they gave forth their lots [their votes]; and the lot fell upon Matthias; and he was numbered with the eleven apostles.
