Lesson 5: Peter's Second Message

Acts 3:12-26

(This lesson includes an explanation of the Abrahamic Covenant)

When Peter saw the reaction of the people to the healing at the temple gate, he began his second recorded sermon:

Ye men of Israel, why marvel ye at this? or why look ye so earnestly on us, as though by our own power or holiness we had made this man to walk?

Acts 3:13-15

- The God of Abraham, and of Isaac, and of Jacob, the God of our fathers, hath glorified his Son Jesus; whom ye delivered up, and denied him in the presence of Pilate, when he was determined to let him go.
- But ye denied the Holy One and the Just, and desired a murderer to be granted unto you;
- ¹⁵ And killed the Prince of life, whom God hath raised from the dead; whereof we are witnesses.

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For the second time, Peter charged the Jews with having a part in the death of Christ.

Acts 3:13-15


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His declaration of "the God of Abraham, and of Isaac, and of Jacob" repeats throughout this message.

And his name through faith in his name hath made this man strong, whom ye see and know: yea, the faith which is by him hath given him this perfect soundness in the presence of you all.

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This was not the first healing done by Peter and John. But this was the first healing done in the name of the risen savior!

Peter must have learned of Christ's prayer on the cross: "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Lk. 23:34).

- 19 Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord;
- And he shall send Jesus Christ,which before was preached untoyou:
- Whom the heaven must receive until the times of restitution of all things, which God hath spoken by the mouth of all his holy prophets since the world began.

To preach forgiveness without repentance gives permission to sin.

To preach repentance without forgiveness leads to legalism.


And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.




Peter called the Jews "the children of the prophets and of the covenant."

God's covenant with the patriarchs Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob is the foundation of his relationship with believers everywhere:








Genesis 17:7-8

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
Isaac also had two sons:
But the Covenant included only Jacob.



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
But the Covenant included only Jacob.

Genesis 35:9-12

- ⁹ And God appeared unto Jacob again, when he came out of Padanaram, and blessed him.

 more Jacob, but Israel shall be thy
 name: and he called his name Israel.

The covenants God had made with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob defined the Jews as a people, and established their relationship with God.

And it was to the Jews first that God sent his Son.
