Paul concludes his instruction on a grace-filled lifestyle:

Chapter 6 begins with counsel on helping Christians who are stumbling in their walk.

Galatians 6:1

Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted.

It is not difficult to understand that this is the best approach.

1 Corinthians 4:21

What will ye? shall I come unto you with a rod, or in love, and in the spirit of meekness?

No one is immune to temptation.

All of our incentives towards goodness comes from the Spirit of Christ within us. Other than that, "there is none that doeth good, no, not one" (Rom. 3:12).

Rejoice = a glorying or boasting.

"... and then shall he have glorying in himself alone, and not by comparison with another."

HAWEIS NEW TESTAMENT (1795)

- ⁴ But let every man prove his own work, and then shall he have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another.
- ⁵ For every man shall bear his own burden.

Our greatest burden – and the one we cannot share – is knowing that we will give account of ourselves to God.

Romans 14:10

But why dost thou judge thy brother? or why dost thou set at nought thy brother? for we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ.

- ⁴ But let every man prove his own work, and then shall he have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another.
- ⁵ For every man shall bear his own burden.

Now Paul writes about the (ideally) symbiotic relationship between a teacher and his congregation.

Galatians 6:6

⁶ Let him that is taught in the word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things.

Now Paul writes about the (ideally) symbiotic relationship between a teacher and his congregation.

Communicate: **κοινωνέω (**koinoneo)

- to come into communion or fellowship with.
- 2. to make one's self a sharer or partner.

Galatians 6:6

⁶ Let him that is taught in the word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things.

This is not a command; he is describing how things should be. As Jesus said, "freely ye have received, freely give" (Matt. 10:8).

Galatians 6:6

⁶ Let him that is taught in the word communicate unto him that teacheth in all good things.

This was another category in which the Galatians were deceived, and in truth, mocking God. They claimed to be sowing to the Spirit but they were sowing to their own flesh.

- Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.
- For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting.

God keeps account of how we respond to our obligations, and whether we are investing in his kingdom or our own.

- ⁷ Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.
- For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting.



WHERE IS YOUR TREASURE?

Matthew 6:19-21

- 19 Lay not up for your selves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal:
- ²⁰ But lay up for your selves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal:
- ²¹ For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

Paul closes this section with an exhortation to steadfastness in good works, and especially within the church.

- 9 And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.
- ¹⁰ As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all *men*, especially unto them who are of the household of faith.

Unlike other occasions, Paul did not dictate this letter to a secretary. Some suggest this was to demonstrate to the Galatians how fully invested he was in their recovery.

Galatians 6:11

11 Ye see how large a letter I have written unto you with mine own hand.

But before he signed and sealed this letter, he extended his condemnation of the legalists by exposing their twisted motivation:

They promoted circumcision only to escape being persecuted themselves!

Galatians 6:12

¹² As many as desire to make a fair shew in the flesh, they constrain you to be circumcised; only lest they should suffer persecution for the cross of Christ.

Furthermore, they had no regard for the countless aspects of the law they left undone. They found glory in the severed foreskins of all the Gentiles they compelled to be cut.

Galatians 6:13

¹³ For neither they themselves who are circumcised keep the law; but desire to have you circumcised, that they may glory in your flesh.

Paul sought glory from a much higher source – even if that meant a life of persecution. He knew that without the cross, all that remains is dead.

Galatians 6:14

But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world.

To avail is to profit or benefit, to be of use.

Blessed are the children of the promise – the heirs of Abraham and the free citizens of Jerusalem which is above.

Galatians 6:16

¹⁶ And as many as walk according to this rule, peace *be* on them, and mercy, and upon the Israel of God.

Knowing that some would refused his correction, Paul did as Christ instructed and "shook off the dust under his feet for a testimony against them" (Mk 6:11).

Galatians 6:17

From henceforth let no man trouble me: for I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus.

He would entertain no more arguments about the requirements of the law, or the authenticity of his ministry and message.

The scars he bore for Christ's sake spoke for themselves.
