


It is our "precious faith" that gives us communion one with another.



But the god they pray to when church is over is negligent and indifferent.




Make the God you worship at church your ONLY God!





In that way, God is limited by a man's faith.

In order to help them grow, Jesus put his disciples in situations that tested the limits of their faith.







The disciples marveled when Jesus calmed the wind and sea. Imagine their astonishment when he walked on water!

The stakes were raised yet higher when Jesus challenged Peter to join him on the water.


- ³⁰ But when he saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord, save me.


Imagine how life would be if we never gave surrendered to doubt!











Jesus lifted his disciples to greater levels of faith as he set greater and greater – and yet achievable – obstacles before them.

- Yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended.



Are ye not much better than they?




- ²⁷ Which of you by taking thought can add one cubit unto his stature?

- ²⁹ And yet I say unto you, That even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these.



Wherefore, if God so clothe the grass of the field, which to day is, and to morrow is cast into the oven, shall he not much more clothe you, O ye of little faith?










Matthew 8:8-9
