


#### 2 Peter 1:5-7, 10

add to your faith



As we read the epistles, we might be puzzled by the apparent conflict between the apostles Paul and James:




Paul wrote that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus.

#### Galatians 2:16

Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ, and not by the works of the law:

for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified.



James seems to hold a different view:

### **James 2:24**

Ye see then how that by works a man is justified, and not by faith only.

Galatians 2:16

Is a man justified by faith, as Paul wrote?
Or is he justified by works, as James wrote?

How can they both be right?

Ye see then how that by works a man is justified, and not by faith only.

To be justified is to be freed of the guilt and penalty of sin.

There is only one way for sinful man to be justified:

#### Romans 3:24-25

- <sup>24</sup> Being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus:
- Whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God;

There is only one way for sinful man to be justified:

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Propitiation: atoning sacrifice

There is only one way for sinful man to be justified:

#### Romans 3:28

Therefore we conclude that a man is justified by faith without the deeds of the law.


Paul and James were speaking of works associated with two very different laws.



Paul was referring to "the works of the law" – the law of Moses; the law of sin and death.

#### **Romans 8:2-4**

- For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death.
- For what the law could not do, in that it was weak through the flesh, God sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and for sin, condemned sin in the flesh:
- <sup>4</sup> That the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.




James wrote of works associated with "the perfect law of liberty."

### **James 1:25**

But whoso looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth therein, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed.

James was not writing about saving grace; he was writing about living faith.




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Authentic, living faith is expressed in deeds, not words:

### James 2:15-17

- 15 If a brother or sister be naked, and destitute of daily food,
- And one of you say unto them, Depart in peace, be ye warmed and filled; notwithstanding ye give them not those things which are needful to the body; what doth it profit?
- <sup>17</sup> Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone.

# What is one thing we don't want to forget?

#### 2 Peter 1:8-10

- For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins.
- Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall:

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(Francis did instruct the friars to "preach by their deeds.")




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

**VIRTUE** is voluntary obedience to truth; the practice of moral duties stemming from sincere love to God and his laws.




**VIRTUE** is voluntary obedience to truth; the practice of moral duties stemming from sincere love to God and his laws.

God "hath called us to glory and virtue" (2 Peter 1:3).




The parable of the good Samaritan is a story of a virtuous man; a man whose faith in the great commandment was evidenced by his deeds.



#### Luke 10:25-29


- <sup>25</sup> And, behold, a certain lawyer stood up, and tempted him, saying, Master, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?

- <sup>27</sup> And he answering said, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbour as thyself.
- <sup>28</sup> And he said unto him, Thou hast answered right: this do, and thou shalt live.
- <sup>29</sup> But he, willing to justify himself, said unto Jesus, And who is my neighbour?







- <sup>34</sup> And went to him, and bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine, and set him on his own beast, and brought him to an inn, and took care of him.











# Luke 10:36-37

To live virtuously is to do what is right, not what is easy for you:



Free of any obligation to her mother-inlaw, Ruth chose to do what was right:


#### **Ruth 1:11**

- Where thou diest, will I die, and there will I be buried: the LORD do so to me, and more also, if ought but death part thee and me.




When she offered herself to Boaz, Ruth cemented her reputation as a virtuous woman:

#### Romans 7:4

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


This is a faithful saying, and these things I will that thou affirm constantly, that they which have believed in God might be careful to maintain good works ...

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To our faith, we add virtue. We add works to our faith.


