


Peter promised that "If ye do these things, ye shall never fall."




2 Peter 1:5-7, 10

- 10 ... give diligence to make your calling and election sure:


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


One might suppose that *knowledge* should be first on the list. But, as Jesus indicated, knowledge needs a key:

Luke 11:52

Woe unto you, lawyers! for ye have taken away the key of knowledge:

ye entered not in yourselves, and them that were entering in ye hindered.



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The key to the knowledge of the truth is faith in God.

Hebrews 4:2

For unto us was the gospel preached, as well as unto them: but the word preached did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in them that heard it.

Knowledge is power... but faith is the *catalyst* to that power.




There is no substitute for faith; no way to get around our need for it.






But faith alone is not enough.













We don't appreciate the great value of having knowledge of God.

And by knowledge shall the chambers be filled with all precious and pleasant riches.






Without faith in God, man is destined to be "ever learning, and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth" (2 Tim 3:7).




Everything begins with faith, because without faith in God, "it is impossible to please him" (Heb 11:6).



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
But "faith without works is dead" (Jms 2:20), and so we must add virtue to our faith – works that show our faith. We are to be "zealous of good works" (Titus 2:14).



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But zeal alone can be a dangerous thing!




Before his conversion, Paul's persecution of the church was fueled by his zeal for the Jews' religion.

Galatians 1:13-14

- 13 For ye have heard of my conversation in time past in the Jews' religion, how that beyond measure I persecuted the church of God, and wasted it:
- And profited in the Jews' religion above many my equals in mine own nation,

being more exceedingly zealous of the traditions of my fathers.

1 Timothy 1:12-13

- And I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who hath enabled me, for that he counted me faithful, putting me into the ministry;
- Who was before a blasphemer, and a persecutor, and injurious: but I obtained mercy, because I did it ignorantly in unbelief.

Having a zeal for God is commendable only when it is "according to knowledge."

Romans 10:2-4

- For I bear them record that they have a zeal of God, but not according to knowledge.
- For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God.
- ⁴ For Christ *is* the end of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth.

The Law proved to everyone under the law that they were guilty before God.

Romans 3:19

Now we know that what things soever the law saith, it saith to them who are under the law: that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God.

There was a time when God overlooked the sin of those who were ignorant of God. But when knowledge came, it brought with it the responsibility to live according to truth.

Acts 17:29-30

- ²⁹ Forasmuch then as we are the offspring of God, we ought not to think that the Godhead is like unto gold, or silver, or stone, graven by art and man's device.
- 30 And the times of this ignorance God winked at; but now commandeth all men every where to repent:

Jesus equated knowing the truth with true freedom.

John 8:31-32

- Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed;
- ³² And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.

Like so many before and after them, these men were blind to their own captivity.

John 8:33

33 They answered him, We be Abraham's seed, and were never in bondage to any man:

how sayest thou, Ye shall be made free?

Ironically, the children of Israel had been subjected to Egyptian, Babylonian, Persian, Greek, and now Roman authority when these words were spoken!

John 8:33

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But Jesus was speaking of a far greater tyranny.

John 8:34-36


- Jesus answered them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Whosoever committeth sin is the servant of sin.
- 35 And the servant abideth not in the house for ever: but the Son abideth ever.
- ³⁶ If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed.

True freedom is to be released from the bondage of sin. And this comes with continuing in the word of the Son, the word of truth.


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
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


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But "faith without works is dead", and so we must add virtue to our faith – works that show our faith.

Now we add to our virtue knowledge, lest our zeal for God be misdirected.

- Finally, brethren, pray for us, that the word of the Lord may have free course, and be glorified, even as it is with you:
- ² And that we may be delivered from unreasonable and wicked men: for all *men* have not faith.

- For we would not, brethren, have you ignorant of our trouble which came to us in Asia, that we were pressed out of measure, above strength, insomuch that we despaired even of life:
- 9 But we had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves, but in God which raiseth the dead:
- Who delivered us from so great a death, and doth deliver: in whom we trust that he will yet deliver us;

Verse 11 again shows the responsibility of those who remain behind, saying, "Ye also helping together by prayer for us."

- 16 For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first:
- ¹⁷ Then we which are alive *and* remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord.
 - Wherefore comfort one another with these words.
