
The three stars of his belt make him easy to locate.


Orion's right shoulder is the star Betelgeuse. It is about 700 times the size of the Sun! The constellations help us draw a map of the stars.


God has also given us ways to map the Holy Scriptures.

In the Bible, the Psalms are divided into five books.
















Each "book" of Psalms shares a theme with one the first 5 books of the Bible.

The EXODUS Book (Deliverance and Redemption)




The LEVITICUS Book (Worship and Sanctuary)




The NUMBERS Book (Wilderness and Wandering)




The DEUTERONOMY Book (Scripture and Praise)




Each "book" ends with a special form of praise called a DOXOLOGY. (We will learn more about this later).



The Book of Psalms concludes with five "Hallelujah" psalms. Each one begins and ends with "Praise ye the Lord."




The FIRST and SECOND psalm of each book have a special purpose.
