## Book One: Psalm 1 to 41

39 written by David 2 are anonymous (Ps 1 and 33)

Book One is the "Genesis" book of Psalms.

Sin entered the world through Adam's disobedience. As a result, God put enmity [strife] between his people [the woman and her seed] and the powers of darkness, [the devil and his seed]. God promised to send a man, born of the woman, who would crush the head of the serpent, and save man from his sins.

#### Genesis 3:15

And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel.

The Genesis book of Psalms speaks of the troubles man faces in the world as he awaits his redemption.

There are 3 divisions in Book One.



**Psalm 1** sets the theme of Book One, and ALL the psalms! That is why some people call Psalm 1 "the psalm of Psalms."

Psalm 1 contrasts the godly man and the ungodly man. It uses an A - B - A - B structure.

<sup>1</sup> Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly,

nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful.

- <sup>2</sup> But his delight *is* in the law of the LORD; and in his law doth he meditate day and night.
- <sup>3</sup> And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.



Genesis 3:15 talks about the "enmity" or hatred that separates the righteous from the wicked. The wicked hate God's people because they hate God and his Son.

#### John 15:18:

If the world hate you, ye know that it hated me before it hated you.

This truth is seen in Psalm 2.



#### Psalm 2 has an A - B - B - A structure.

DERISION is ridicule or mockery. The tiger laughed with derision at the mouse who threatened to kill him.

  - <sup>8</sup> Ask of me, and I shall give *thee* the heathen *for* thine inheritance, and the uttermost parts of the earth *for* thy possession.
- <sup>9</sup> Thou shalt break them with a rod of iron; thou shalt dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel.

A DECREE is a command from an authority.

Blessed are all they that put their trust in him.

As Proverbs 1:7 says, "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge."


#### Psalm 3 and 5 are MORNING prayers.



## **Psalm 3:5** I laid me down and slept; I awaked; for the LORD sustained me.

#### Psalm 5:3

My voice shalt thou hear in the morning, O LORD; in the morning will I direct *my prayer* unto thee, and will look up.



#### Psalm 4:8

I will both lay me down in peace, and sleep: for thou, LORD, only makest me dwell in safety.

#### Psalm 6:6

I am weary with my groaning; all the night make I my bed to swim; I water my couch with my tears.

# Psalm 3 teaches us about our deliverance from our enemies.



#### It tells a story in three parts.

He begins by talking about the people who bring trouble to his life.

**Selah** is a musical mark indicating a pause in the singing during which only the instruments are heard. This word is found 71 times in Psalms, and 3 times in Habakkuk.

Things start to change for this man when he takes his eyes off of his enemies, and turns his eyes toward God.


Psalm 3:5-8

- <sup>5</sup> I laid me down and slept;I awaked; for the LORD sustained me.
- <sup>6</sup> I will not be afraid of ten thousands of people, that have set *themselves* against me round about.
- Arise, O LORD; save me, O my God:
   for thou hast smitten all mine enemies upon the cheek bone;
   thou hast broken the teeth of the ungodly.
- <sup>8</sup> Salvation *belongeth* unto the LORD: thy blessing *is* upon thy people. Selah.

Now he does not care if his enemies MULTIPLY. He knows God is on his side!



Psalm 4 is a prayer for the evening. This psalm also tells the story of a man's journey from fear to confidence.



Again, we see three parts. Look for the changes that take place in his heart.

- <sup>2</sup> O ye sons of men, how long will ye turn my glory into shame? how long will ye love vanity, and seek after leasing [lies]? Selah.




- <sup>5</sup> Offer the sacrifices of righteousness, and put your trust in the LORD.

   LORD, lift thou up the light of thy countenance upon us.
- <sup>7</sup> Thou hast put gladness in my heart, more than in the time *that* their corn and their wine increased.
- <sup>8</sup> I will both lay me down in peace, and sleep: for thou, LORD, only makest me dwell in safety.



- ... have mercy upon me, and hear my prayer.
- <sup>3</sup> ... the LORD will hear when I call unto him.
- <sup>8</sup> I will both lay me down in peace, and sleep: for thou, LORD, only makest me dwell in safety.

When you KNOW that God is merciful, and you KNOW that he has heard your prayer, you can sleep in peace.

Psalm 5 is another morning prayer. But this is an *imprecatory* prayer. To *imprecate* is to curse. The writer wants to see the wrath of God come down on his enemies.



#### He asks God to act FOR the righteous, and AGAINST the wicked.



- <sup>12</sup> For thou, LORD, wilt bless the righteous; with favour wilt thou compass him as *with* a shield.

Verse 10 says: "Destroy thou them, O God; let them fall by their own counsels."

How does this fit with Matthew 5:44?

"Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you."

There is nothing wrong with the desire for justice, but we must leave this in God's hands: "Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but *rather* give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance *is* mine; I will repay, saith the Lord" (Romans 12:19).



Psalm 6 is another evening prayer. We read of a man who is vexed by his enemies and feeling abandoned by the Lord.



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The word "vexed" appears 3 times in Psalm 3. It is a feeling of extreme irritation and distress. Abraham's nephew Lot was "vexed" by what he saw in Sodom and Gomorrah (2 Pet 2:7).



At first, it was the psalmist who was feeling "vexed". But when he turned to God, he realized that it was his enemies who will be ashamed and "sore vexed". This is something we need to remember in our times of trouble.

- <sup>3</sup> When I consider thy heavens, the work of thy fingers, the moon and the stars, which thou hast ordained;
- <sup>4</sup> What is man, that thou art mindful of him? and the son of man, that thou visitest him?
- <sup>5</sup> For thou hast made him a little lower than the angels, and hast crowned him with glory and honour.

The Psalmist wonders why man, who is so small, deserves attention from God, who is so mighty.

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# God "visited" his people when he sent Jesus to us.

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# Verse 5 is quoted – and explained – in the book of Hebrews.

Jesus was made "a little lower than the angels" so he could die for our sins.

#### Hebrews 2:9

But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man.

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#### Psalm 8:6-8

- <sup>6</sup> Thou madest him to have dominion over the works of thy hands;
  - thou hast put all things under his feet:
- <sup>7</sup> All sheep and oxen,yea, and the beasts of the field;
- <sup>8</sup> The fowl of the air, and the fish of the sea, *and whatsoever* passeth through the paths of the seas.

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This psalm ends the same way it began:

Psalm 8:9
9 O LORD our Lord, how excellent *is* thy name in all the earth!

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#### Psalm 8:9

9 O LORD our Lord, how excellent is thy name in all the earth!

#### And this ends Part One of Book One of the Psalms.
