
God used Nathan to show David that he could not hide his sin. But God could not *forgive* David until he *acknowledged* his wrongdoing and repented of his sin. Psalm 51 is David's psalm of repentance "when Nathan the prophet came unto him, after he had gone in to Bathsheba."


God gave us the laws of righteous living, summarized by the two great commandments – to love God and love our neighbor. When David committed adultery with Bathsheba and arranged for Uriah to be killed, he broke the second commandment. Since GOD gave us these commandments, a sin against our neighbor is a sin against God.

To have a broken spirit does not mean to be sad or depressed. It means to be submitted to God. One of the most beautiful animals in the world is a wild horse. It is like poetry to watch it run. But until that horse's spirit is broken, it has no use to man. He cannot ride it, and he cannot use it to pull a wagon. People are like horses. They can be beautiful and talented and smart, but until they are submitted to God, they are useless to him.







Both psalms begin the same way.

- ² **The LORD** looked down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there were any that did understand, *and* seek God.

Ps 14 refers to the Almighty as the LORD (Jehovah). *Jehovah* is the God of "those that have made a covenant with me by sacrifice" (Ps 50:5).




