This pattern – complaint, trust, praise – is twice repeated.



- For, lo, they lie in wait for my soul: the mighty are gathered against me; not for my transgression, nor for my sin, O LORD.
- They run and prepare themselves without my fault: awake to help me, and behold.
- Thou therefore, O LORD God of hosts, the God of Israel, awake to visit all the heathen: be not merciful to any wicked transgressors. Selah.


Psalm 59:16-17


- But I will sing of thy power; yea, I will sing aloud of thy mercy in the morning: for thou hast been my defence and refuge in the day of my trouble.
- ¹⁷ Unto thee, O my strength, will I sing: for God is my defence, and the God of my mercy.



The prayer of Psalm 60 is as true today as when it was first inspired by God: "Give us help from trouble: for vain is the help of man."

Without God's help, we are doomed.

 O turn thyself to us again.
- Thou hast made the earth to tremble; thou hast broken it: heal the breaches thereof; for it shaketh.
- Thou hast shewed thy people hard things: thou hast made us to drink the wine of astonishment.
- ⁴ Thou hast given a banner to them that fear thee, that it may be displayed because of the truth. Selah.
- 5 That thy beloved may be delivered; save with thy right hand, and hear me.
