


Lesson 15 The 5 Hallelujah Psalms Psalm 146 to 150

The Book of Psalms closes with five "Hallelujah" psalms, so called because each one begins and ends with "Praise ye the LORD."

In Hebrew, Hallelu-JAH literally means Hail Jehovah.



Each of these psalms correspond to one of the five books of Moses and follows its themes.

Ps 146: Book 1, Genesis
Ps 147: Book 2, Exodus
Ps 148: Book 3, Leviticus
Ps 149: Book 4, Numbers
Ps 150: Book 5, Deuteronomy



Book 1 is the Genesis book, and Psalm 146 follows its theme of MAN AND CREATION.






- ³ Put not your trust in princes, nor in the son of man, in whom there is no help.


- ⁵ Happy *is he* that *hath* the God of Jacob for his help, whose hope *is* in the LORD his God:


- ^{7b} The LORD looseth the prisoners:

Book 3 is the Leviticus book, and Psalm 148 follows its theme of WORSHIP and SANCTUARY. Only the chosen of God can come near to him.

- ² Praise ye him, all his angels: praise ye him, all his hosts.
- ³ Praise ye him, sun and moon:praise him, all ye stars of light.
- ⁴ Praise him, ye heavens of heavens, and ye waters that *be* above the heavens.
- ⁵ Let them praise the name of the LORD: for he commanded, and they were created.
- ⁶ He hath also stablished them for ever and ever: he hath made a decree which shall not pass.

Ps 149: The 4th Hallelujah Psalm: NUMBERS




Book 4 is the Numbers book and follows its theme of WILDERNESS and WANDERING. But when the King of kings returns to establish his kingdom on earth, Israel will rejoice and find rest in Zion. And just as Joshua led Israel to drive the heathen from the Land of Canaan, Jesus and his saints will cleanse the earth of paganism once and for all.

Psalm 149:1-4

- Praise ye the LORD.
 Sing unto the LORD a new song,
 and his praise in the congregation of saints.
- Let Israel rejoice in him that made him:
 let the children of Zion be joyful in their King.
- Let them praise his name in the dance:
 let them sing praises unto him with the timbrel and harp.
- ⁴ For the LORD taketh pleasure in his people: he will beautify the meek with salvation.

The heathen vanquished

Psalm 149:5-9

- Let the saints be joyful in glory:
 let them sing aloud upon their beds.
- ⁶ Let the high praises of God be in their mouth, and a twoedged sword in their hand;
- ⁷ To execute vengeance upon the heathen, and punishments upon the people;
- ⁸ To bind their kings with chains, and their nobles with fetters of iron;
- ⁹ To execute upon them the judgment written: this honour have all his saints.

Ps 150: The 5th Hallelujah Psalm: DEUTERONOMY



Book 5 is the Deuteronomy book, and follows its theme of SCRIPTURE and PRAISE. God magnified his word above all his name, and he called his word Jesus. Psalm 150 sings out in praise to the Eternal King who shall reign forevermore.

Ps 150: The 5th Hallelujah Psalm: DEUTERONOMY



Psalm 150:1-5

- Praise ye the LORD. Praise God in his sanctuary: praise him in the firmament of his power.
- ² Praise him for his mighty acts:
 praise him according to his excellent greatness.
- ³ Praise him with the sound of the trumpet: praise him with the psaltery and harp.
- ⁴ Praise him with the timbrel and dance:
 praise him with stringed instruments and organs.
- ⁵ Praise him upon the loud cymbals: praise him upon the high sounding cymbals.
