Americans are likely to associate Thanksgiving with the feast shared by the Pilgrims and indigenous people in 1621.




But as Christians, we know that Thanksgiving is much more than an annual celebration. For the people of God, thanksgiving is a way of life.

We are commanded to give thanks in every situation.

1 Thessalonians 5:18

¹⁸ In every thing give thanks:
for this is the will of God in
Christ Jesus concerning you.

We are commanded to give thanks FOR every situation.

Ephesians 5:20

²⁰ Giving thanks always
for all things
unto God and the Father in the
name of our Lord Jesus Christ;

We should give thanks in our prayers for our society.

1 Timothy 2:1-2

- ¹ I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men;
- ² For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty.

Our thankfulness should be evident in both our words and deeds.

Colossians 3:17

¹⁷ And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him.

We should give thanks for being called into the church of Jesus Christ.

Colossians 3:15

¹⁵ And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body; and be ye thankful.

Giving thanks is an essential part of our prayers, and the doorway to peace.

Philippians 4:6-7

- ⁶ Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.
- ⁷ And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

We should be thankful for other Christians,
and treat them as the elect of God.

2 Thessalonians 2:13

¹³ But we are bound to give thanks alway to God for you, brethren beloved of the Lord, because God hath from the beginning chosen you to salvation through sanctification of the Spirit and belief of the truth:

We should give thanks to God for our
“Victory in Jesus” over sin and death.

1 Corinthians 15:56-57

- ⁵⁶ The sting of death *is* sin; and
the strength of sin *is* the law.
- ⁵⁷ But thanks *be* to God, which
giveth us the victory through
our Lord Jesus Christ.

We should give thanks for our triumphs over life's adversities.

2 Corinthians 2:14

¹⁴ Now thanks be unto God, which always causeth us to triumph in Christ, and maketh manifest the savour of his knowledge by us in every place.

We should abound in thanksgiving.

Colossians 2:6-7

- ⁶ As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in him:
- ⁷ Rooted and built up in him, and stablished in the faith, as ye have been taught, abounding therein with thanksgiving.



We are told to present ourselves before God as living sacrifices.

Romans 12:1

¹ I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.



Let our sacrifice be one of praise.

Hebrews 13:15

¹⁵ By him therefore let us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually, that is, the fruit of our lips giving thanks to his name.
