




After spending the night in Bethany, Jesus and his disciples returned to Jerusalem.





- Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them.






Only Mark includes this part of the teaching:

Later that day, the Sadducees tried to make Jesus stumble with a question about the resurrection – something that they themselves did not believe in!

(These men had no interest in learning anything from Jesus. They only wanted to show that they were smarter than him.)



Matthew 22:23-28

- ²³ The same day came to him the Sadducees, which say that there is no resurrection, and asked him,
- ²⁴ Saying,
 - Master, Moses said, If a man die, having no children, his brother shall marry his wife, and raise up seed unto his brother.
- ²⁵ Now there were with us seven brethren: and the first, when he had married a wife, deceased, and, having no issue, left his wife unto his brother:
- ²⁶ Likewise the second also, and the third, unto the seventh.
- ²⁷ And last of all the woman died also.
- ²⁸ Therefore in the resurrection whose wife shall she be of the seven? for they all had her.

Jesus exposed their ignorance of the true things of God.



Matthew 22:23-33:

- ²⁹ Jesus answered and said unto them, Ye do err, not knowing the scriptures, nor the power of God.
- ³⁰ For in the resurrection they neither marry, nor are given in marriage, but are as the angels of God in heaven.
- But as touching the resurrection of the dead, have ye not read that which was spoken unto you by God, saying,
- I am the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac,
 and the God of Jacob?
 God is not the God of the dead, but of the living.
- ³³ And when the multitude heard *this*, they were astonished at his doctrine.

Jesus answered a scribe's honest question about the commandments.



Mark 12:28-31:


- ²⁸ And one of the scribes came, and having heard them reasoning together, and perceiving that he had answered them well, asked him, Which is the first commandment of all?
- ²⁹ And Jesus answered him, The first of all the commandments *is*, Hear, O Israel; The Lord our God is one Lord:
- ³⁰ And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength: this *is* the first commandment.
- And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these.



Mark 12:32-34:

- ³² And the scribe said unto him, Well, Master, thou hast said the truth: for there is one God; and there is none other but he:
- ³³ And to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the soul, and with all the strength, and to love *his* neighbour as himself, is more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices.
- And when Jesus saw that he answered discreetly, he said unto him,
 Thou art not far from the kingdom of God.

And no man after that durst ask him any question.



Now, Jesus had a question for them all to consider:





- 45 Then in the audience of all the people he said unto his disciples,
- 46 Beware of the scribes, which desire to walk in long robes, and love greetings in the markets, and the highest seats in the synagogues, and the chief rooms at feasts;
- 47 Which devour widows' houses, and for a shew make long prayers: the same shall receive greater damnation.

One can only imagine their anger at being exposed in front of all the people.

The Lord's condemnation of the scribes and Pharisees is recorded in Matthew's 23rd chapter:



- Wherefore ye be witnesses unto yourselves, that ye are the children of them which killed the prophets.
- ³² Fill ye up then the measure of your fathers.

According to Geneva Bible Notes, this is a proverb used by the Jews that means, "You go on also, and follow your ancestors, that at length your wickedness may come to its fulness."

Zacharias was a prophet when the Persians ruled over Israel:

Zechariah 1:1

In the eighth month, in the second year of Darius, came the word of the LORD unto Zechariah, the son of Berechiah, the son of Iddo the prophet...

Matthew 23:33-36

- ³³ Ye serpents, ye generation of vipers, how can ye escape the damnation of hell?
- Wherefore, behold, I send unto you prophets, and wise men, and scribes: and some of them ye shall kill and crucify; and some of them shall ye scourge in your synagogues, and persecute them from city to city:
- 35 That upon you may come all the righteous blood shed upon the earth, from the blood of righteous Abel unto the blood of Zacharias son of Barachias, whom ye slew between the temple and the altar.
- ³⁶ Verily I say unto you, All these things shall come upon this generation.

This spans the time from Cain all the way to the end of the Old Testament!

Speaking as the heavenly Father, Jesus cried for all the good that was intended for the chosen people that they walked away from.

Matthew 23:37

³⁷ O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee,

how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and ye would not!

Israel would not see these blessings until the day Jesus returned to establish his kingdom on earth.






Jesus left the scribes and Pharisees, no doubt exhausted from the heartache they caused him. Then, as he was leaving the courtyard of the temple, he watched a poor widow give her offering.

Her pure faith and devotion must have lifted his heart.



Mark 12:41-44

- ⁴¹ And Jesus sat over against the treasury, and beheld how the people cast money into the treasury: and many that were rich cast in much.
- ⁴² And there came a certain poor widow, and she threw in two mites, which make a farthing.
- ⁴³ And he called *unto him* his disciples, and saith unto them,
 Verily I say unto you,
 That this poor widow hath cast more in, than all they which have cast into the treasury:
- ⁴⁴ For all they did cast in of their abundance; but she of her want did cast in all that she had, even all her living.



As Jesus left the temple for the final time, he foretold its destruction:

Mark 13:1-2


- And as he went out of the temple, one of his disciples saith unto him, Master, see what manner of stones and what buildings are here!
- And Jesus answering said unto him, Seest thou these great buildings? there shall not be left one stone upon another, that shall not be thrown down.


