There were THREE occasions when Jesus was anointed with oil.




 Early in his ministry at the home of Simon the <u>Pharisee</u>.



2. Six days before the Passover, at the home of Lazarus in Bethany.



3. Less than two days before the Passover, at the home of Simon the leper.




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It is often said that this was Mary Magdalene, but this cannot be proven scripturally.



## Luke 7:36-38

- him that he would eat with him. And he went into the Pharisee's house, and sat down to meat.
- 37 And, behold, a woman in the city, which was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at meat in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster box of ointment,
- And stood at his feet behind him weeping, and began to wash his feet with tears, and did wipe them with the hairs of her head, and kissed his feet, and anointed them with the ointment.

The Pharisee objected because of the woman's bad reputation.



## Luke 7:39

Now when the Pharisee which had bidden him saw it, he spake within himself, saying,

This man, if he were a prophet, would have known who and what manner of woman this is that toucheth him: for she is a sinner.

# Jesus used the occasion to teach why some people love God more than others:




## Luke 7:40-43

- 4º And Jesus answering said unto him, Simon, I have somewhat to say unto thee. And he saith, Master, say on.
- <sup>41</sup> There was a certain creditor which had two debtors: the one owed five hundred pence, and the other fifty.
- <sup>42</sup> And when they had nothing to pay, he frankly forgave them both. Tell me therefore, which of them will love him most?
- 43 Simon answered and said,
  I suppose that *he*, to whom he forgave most.
  And he said unto him,
  Thou hast rightly judged.



The second anointing is recorded only in John's gospel.


"Six days before the passover" Mary, the sister of Lazarus and Martha, anointed Christ's feet with an expensive ointment called spikenard.



# This took place at their home in Bethany.

## John 12:1-3

- 1 Then Jesus six days before the passover came to Bethany, where Lazarus was which had been dead, whom he raised from the dead.
- There they made him a supper; and Martha served: but Lazarus was one of them that sat at the table with him.
- Then took Mary a pound of ointment of spikenard, very costly, and anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped his feet with her hair: and the house was filled with the odour of the ointment.




## Judas Iscariot condemned her act as a waste of money.

## John 12:4-8

- <sup>4</sup> Then saith one of his disciples, Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, which should betray him,
- Why was not this ointment sold for three hundred pence, and given to the poor?
- This he said, not that he cared for the poor; but because he was a thief, and had the bag, and bare what was put therein.
- 7 Then said Jesus, Let her alone: against the day of my burying hath she kept this.
- For the poor always ye have with you; but me ye have not always.





The third time Jesus was anointed was on Tuesday evening of the Passion Week.

Jesus and his disciples were back in
Bethany for the start of Nisan 13.




At the home of Simon the leper, an unnamed woman anointed his head.



This time, *all* the disciples objected.

## Matthew 26:6-9


- <sup>6</sup> Now when Jesus was in Bethany, in the house of Simon the leper,
- <sup>7</sup> There came unto him a woman having an alabaster box of very precious ointment, and poured it on his head, as he sat *at meat*.
- 8 But when his disciples saw it, they had indignation, saying, To what purpose is this waste?
- For this ointment might have been sold for much, and given to the poor.



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
"Simon" was a very common name – we have read of the Pharisee named Simon; Simon, the father of Judas; and now Simon the leper. Of course, there was also Simon Peter.



## Matthew 26:6-9


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Was Judas having an evil influence on the other disciples? This is the same argument he made some days earlier.




#### Matthew 26:10-13

- When Jesus understood it, he said unto them, Why trouble ye the woman? for she hath wrought a good work upon me.
- 11 For ye have the poor always with you; but me ye have not always.
- <sup>12</sup> For in that she hath poured this ointment on my body, she did *it* for my burial.
- Verily I say unto you,
  Wheresoever this gospel shall be preached in the whole world,
  there shall also this, that this woman hath done, be told for a memorial of her.



His answer satisfied all his disciples but one.



# Luke 22:3-4


- Then entered Satan into Judas surnamed Iscariot, being of the number of the twelve.
- <sup>4</sup> And he went his way, and communed with the chief priests and captains, how he might betray him unto them.




## Luke 22:5-6

- And they were glad,and covenanted to give him money.
- <sup>6</sup> And he promised, and sought opportunity to betray him unto them in the absence of the multitude.








The next 24 hours would be Jesus' last with his disciples before his betrayal and arrest.


At the home of Simon the leper Mt 26:12: she did it for my burial. Mk 14:8: she is come aforehand to anoint my body to the burying.

















# Why was Jesus anointed three times?
