# (This new timeline is not of the entire week, but the day itself.)






The killing of the paschal lambs took place in the late afternoon.

The Passover meal would begin in the evening and continue into Nisan 15, the start of the Feast of Unleavened Bread.

#### Numbers 28:16-17


- <sup>16</sup> And in the fourteenth day of the first month *is* the passover of the LORD.
- <sup>17</sup> And in the fifteenth day of this month *is* the feast: seven days shall unleavened bread be eaten.



### Exodus 12:8-11

- <sup>8</sup> And they shall eat the flesh in that night, roast with fire, and unleavened bread; and with bitter herbs they shall eat it.
- <sup>9</sup> Eat not of it raw, nor sodden at all with water, but roast with fire; his head with his legs, and with the purtenance thereof.
- <sup>10</sup> And ye shall let nothing of it remain until the morning; and that which remaineth of it until the morning ye shall burn with fire.
- <sup>11</sup> And thus shall ye eat it; with your loins girded, your shoes on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and ye shall eat it in haste: it is the LORD'S passover.







- <sup>12</sup> And he shall shew you a large upper room furnished: there make ready.
- <sup>13</sup> And they went, and found as he had said unto them: and they made ready the passover.



The Upper Room or *Cenacle* is said to be in the southern part of the Old City of Jerusalem on Mount Zion.



The buildings that stand there today date back only to the 12<sup>th</sup> Century.

The Last Supper took place almost 24 hours before the Passover meal.



Jesus had hoped to eat the passover with his apostles, but now he knew this would not happen.

### Luke 22:14-16

<sup>14</sup> And when the hour was come, he sat down, and the twelve apostles with him.

### <sup>15</sup> And he said unto them,

- With desire I have desired to eat this passover with you before I suffer:
- <sup>16</sup> For I say unto you,
  - I will not any more eat thereof, until it be fulfilled in the kingdom of God.



John confirms that the Last Supper took place *before* the Passover feast.

#### John 13:1

Now before the feast of the passover, when Jesus knew that his hour was come that he should depart out of this world unto the Father, having loved his own which were in the world, he loved them unto the end.

# Mark 14:18-19

- <sup>18</sup> And as they sat and did eat, Jesus said,
   Verily I say unto you,
   One of you which eateth with me shall betray me.
- <sup>19</sup> And they began to be sorrowful, and to say unto him one by one, *Is* it I? and another *said*, *Is* it I?







The sop was a piece of the bread that the host would dip it into the broth and give it to one of his guests as a sign of love and friendship.



Jesus gave Judas the sop to show his love for him – even though he knew Judas would betray him!



John 13:27 <sup>27</sup> And after the sop Satan entered into him. Then said Jesus unto him, That thou doest, do quickly.



## John 13:28-29

- <sup>28</sup> Now no man at the table knew for what intent he spake this unto him.
- <sup>29</sup> For some of them thought, because Judas had the bag, that Jesus had said unto him, Buy those things that we have need of against the feast; or, that he should give something to the poor.

- <sup>6</sup> ... I am the way, the truth, and the life:no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.
- <sup>18</sup> I will not leave you comfortless:I will come to you.
- <sup>27</sup> Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

# Only Luke recorded this new directive Jesus gave to his apostles:



### Luke 22:35-38

- <sup>35</sup> And he said unto them, When I sent you without purse, and scrip, and shoes, lacked ye any thing? And they said, Nothing.
- <sup>36</sup> Then said he unto them,
  - But now, he that hath a purse, let him take *it*, and likewise *his* scrip:
  - and he that hath no sword,
  - let him sell his garment, and buy one.
- <sup>37</sup> For I say unto you, that this that is written must yet be accomplished in me,
  - And he was reckoned among the transgressors: for the things concerning me have an end.
- <sup>38</sup> And they said, Lord, behold, here *are* two swords. And he said unto them, It is enough.



<sup>36</sup> Then said he unto them,
But now, he that hath a purse, let him take *it*, and likewise *his* scrip:

A **purse** is a money bag. A **scrip** is a leather sack in which travelers and shepherds carried their provisions.



David "chose him five smooth stones out of the brook, and put them in a shepherd's bag which he had, **even in a scrip**" (1 Samuel 17:40).
