Why? Because "the fear of the LORD is the **beginning** of knowledge." (Prov. 1:7)

Three pairs of men are mentioned in this epistle:

- 1. Phygellus and Hermogenes turned away from the truth (1:15).
- 2. Hymenaeus and Philetus *erred* concerning the truth (2:17,18).
- 3. Jannes and Jambres resisted the truth.



Jannes and Jambres are not identified in the Bible, but they are generally understood to be the magicians in Pharaoh's court.

Paul's own character stands in contrast to what we have read so far in this chapter.

2 Timothy 3:12

Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution.

Jesus said, "If they have persecuted me, they will also persecute you" (John 15:20).



2 Timothy 3:13

¹³ But evil men and seducers shall wax [grow] worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived.

Sometimes it will feel like evil is winning.



2 Timothy 3:14-15

- ¹⁴ But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them;
- ¹⁵ And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

Christians who are not rooted and grounded in the truth will be pulled from the faith. This is why we must be educated in the holy Scriptures.



CORRECTION	Instruction to bring us back to the true faith.	Ezekiel 18:30: Repent, and turn yourselves from your idols; and turn away your faces from all your abominations.
