Chapter 1 ends with an exhortation from Paul to other Christians who suffer for the sake of the gospel.

Philippians 1:27

In this verse, your conversation is not just the things you talk about. It is your way of life.

Philippians 1:27

To be "becoming" is to be attractive and suitable, as in "that hairstyle is becoming on you."

Philippians 1:27

Proverbs 11:22 speaks of a thing that is NOT "becoming."

(When you read this verse, remember that WE are the bride of Christ!)

Philippians 1:27

Only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ: that whether I come and see you, or else be absent, I may hear of your affairs, that ye stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel;

Proverbs 11:22

²² As a jewel of gold in a swine's snout, so is a fair [beautiful] woman which is without discretion.

In Ephesians 4:1, the same Greek word was translated "worthy."

Philippians 1:27

Only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ: that whether I come and see you, or else be absent, I may hear of your affairs, that ye stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel;

Ephesians 4:1

I therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called...

"Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ..."

Philippians 1:27

Most Christians put on their best behavior when the respected elder comes to visit. Paul wanted them to live to please Christ, not for him.

Philippians 1:27

The advancement of the gospel requires the united effort of committed people –

In ONE spirit, with ONE mind.

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As we shall later see, this verse sets the theme of this entire epistle.

Paul encourages
Christian suffering
from persecution
to be courageous in
their afflictions.

Philippians 1:28

²⁸ And in nothing terrified by your adversaries: which is to them an evident token of perdition, but to you of salvation, and that of God.

Your fearlessness in the face of your enemies is a sign to THEM of their perdition, or final destruction.

Philippians 1:28

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Perdition:

The utter loss of the soul or of final happiness in a future state; future misery or eternal death.

The impenitent sinner is condemned to final perdition. If we reject the truth, we seal our own perdition.

From Webster's 1812 Dictionary

It is a sign to YOU of the victory you have in Christ.

Philippians 1:28

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The courage you show is itself a gift from God.

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²⁸ And in nothing terrified by your adversaries: which is to them an evident token of perdition, but to you of salvation, and that of God.

2 Timothy 1:7

For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.

The courage you show is itself a gift from God.

Philippians 1:28

²⁸ And in nothing terrified by your adversaries: which is to them an evident token of perdition, but to you of salvation, and that of God.

"Be brave when you face your enemies. Your courage will show them that they are going to be destroyed, and it will show you that you will be saved. God will make all of this happen."

Contemporary English Version

Very few Christians have the faith to see that it is a gift from God both to BELIEVE on him and to SUFFER for his name.

Philippians 1:29

For unto you it is given in the behalf of Christ, not only to believe on him, but also to suffer for his sake; Remember the testimony of the early apostles after they were arrested and beaten:

Acts 5:40-42

- 40 ... and when they [the chief priests] had called the apostles, and beaten them, they commanded that they should not speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go.
- ⁴¹ And they departed from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for his name.
- 42 And daily in the temple, and in every house, they ceased not to teach and preach Jesus Christ.

Paul knew of the believers in Philippi were also suffering for the sake of Christ.

Philippians 1:30

³⁰ Having the same conflict [struggle] which ye saw in me, and now hear to be in me.

Paul knew of the believers in Philippi were also suffering for the sake of Christ.



In Chapter 3, Paul will speak of the "fellowship of his sufferings" that leads to increased understanding of Christ. But for now, this concludes Chapter One.

- 1-8 Paul testifies his thankfulness to God, and his love towards them, for the fruits of their faith, and fellowship in his sufferings;
- 9-11 daily praying to him for their increase in grace;
- 12-20 he shows what good the faith of Christ had received by his troubles at Rome;
- 21-26 and how ready he is to glorify Christ either by his life or death;
 - 27 exhorting them to unity;
- 28-30 and to fortitude in persecution.
