It takes unity of purpose to live the gospel. This unity is difficult to achieve and easy to lose.




In Chapters 2 to 4, Paul exposes three obstructions to this unity, and the remedy to those obstructions.





Paul begins with four blessings from Christ that he offers every Christian:

Philippians 2:1

Our consolation in Christ is the relief Jesus brings to our heart and mind that soothes the injuries of life.

Philippians 2:1

Is there a greater comfort than to know you are loved by your heavenly Father?

Philippians 2:1

Our God is the God of consolation and the God of all comfort.

Philippians 2:1

If there be therefore any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the Spirit, if any bowels and mercies,

Romans 15:5

Now the God of patience and consolation grant you to be likeminded one toward another according to Christ Jesus:

2 Corinthians 1:3

Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort;

What greater companionship could be found than the fellowship we share with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit?

Philippians 2:1

Lamentations 3:22-23

- ²² It is of the LORD'S mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not.
- ²³ They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness.

Seeing that these things flow from the heart of Christ to us, they should flow through us to one another. This brings joy to the heart of God!

Philippians 2:1-2

- If there be therefore any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the Spirit, if any bowels and mercies,
- Fulfil ye my joy, that ye be likeminded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind.

Being likeminded doesn't mean that each member should act and think just like the other. That is how cults are born!

This unity comes when every member agrees with Christ.

Philippians 2:1-2

- If there be therefore any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the Spirit, if any bowels and mercies,
- Fulfil ye my joy, that ye be likeminded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind.

But when church members try to advance their own positions in the congregation by climbing over each other, this unity is lost.

Philippians 2:3a

3 Let nothing be done through strife or vainglory;



But when church members try to advance their own positions in the congregation, stepping on each other to climb higher, this unity is lost.

Philippians 2:3a

3 Let nothing be done through strife or vainglory;

STRIFE:

Exertion or contention for superiority.

VAINGLORY:

Exclusive vanity excited by one's own performances; empty pride; undue elation of mind.

Webster's 1812 Dictionary

The cure for strife and rivalries is humility.

The humility needed to ensure unity was perfectly embodied by Jesus. It is his example that Paul calls upon the church to embrace.

Paul takes us back to the beginning when the Son of God coexisted with the Father. As John 1:1 says, "the Word was with God, and the Word was God." He was in "the form of God."



An isosceles triangle has two equal sides and two equal angles across from them.



Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God:

The equality of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is illustrated in "The Trinity Shield."



The Son of God came down from his heavenly throne and clothed himself in the likeness of humanity. He came to serve, not to be served.

Now we read verses 6 and 7 together.

Philippians 2:6-7

- Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God:
- But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men:

The Lord's humility was made manifest by his obedience. This is the mind of Christ.

Philippians 2:8

And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

He allowed himself to become mortal so he could be offered as a sacrifice for our sins.

And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

Hebrews 2:9

9 But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man.

The Lord's obedience led to his exaltation and established his authority over all creation.

Philippians 2:9-11

- 9 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:
- That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth;
- And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Following the example set by Jesus, we should also seek the kind of exaltation that only God can give.

Philippians 2:9-11

- 9 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:
- That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth;
- And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

1 Peter 5:6

6 Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time:

This is the only reference from the Old Testament in this epistle.

Philippians 2:9-11

- 9 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:
- That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth;
- And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Isaiah 45:23

²³ I have sworn by myself, the word is gone out of my mouth *in* righteousness, and shall not return, That unto me every knee shall bow, every tongue shall swear.

Now, with the example of Christ fresh on our minds, Paul exhorts the church to a higher plane of living.

Philippians 2:12

Wherefore, my beloved, as ye have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling.

For the second time in this letter, Paul emphasizes that our obedience must be to Christ alone.

"Working out" does not create muscles; it develops them to the point they are noticeable.

"Working out" does not create muscles; it develops them to the point they are noticeable.

Philippians 2:12

Wherefore, my beloved, as ye have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling.

To "work out your own salvation" is to "exercise" yourself "unto godliness" (1 Tim. 4:7). This makes your salvation – and the fact that you belong to Christ – visible to others.

The desire you have to please God does not come from within you. It comes from God.

¹³ For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure.

Because it is God at work in us to obey him, we must be careful not to murmur against the Spirit as the children of Israel murmured against Moses.

Philippians 2:14-15

- 14 Do all things without murmurings and disputings:
- 15 That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world;

Rebuke from the world is inevitable, but let us not give ammunition to our enemies, neither give God cause to be displeased with us.

Philippians 2:14-15

- ¹⁴ Do all things without murmurings and disputings:
- 15 That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world;

Psalm 38:1-2

- O LORD, rebuke me not in thy wrath: neither chasten me in thy hot displeasure.
- ² For thine arrows stick fast in me, and thy hand presseth me sore.

Christians who do not put on the mind of Christ will be just as crooked and perverse as the unbelievers around them.

Philippians 2:14-15

- ¹⁴ Do all things without murmurings and disputings:
- That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world;

Deuteronomy 32:5

They have corrupted themselves, their spot is not the spot of his children: they are a perverse and crooked generation.

But those who put on the mind of Christ will as a light in a dark place.
