

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
God desires his church to be unified in spirit and in mind. Without it, we will never STRIVE TOGETHER for the faith of the gospel.


Philippians 1:27

Only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ: that whether I come and see you, or else be absent, I may hear of your affairs, that ye stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel;



In Chapters 2 to 4, Paul exposes the things that disrupt that unity.





He identified three false doctrines that disrupt the unity of the church: The false doctrine that ties salvation to the Law of Moses. The false doctrine that claims Christians are perfect now and have no need for improvement. The false doctrine that encourages Christians to live for the pleasures and comforts of this present world.

Chapter 3: PAUL'S APPEAL TO HAVE THE KNOWLEDGE OF CHRIST

Paul knew he had to continually warn the church of the dangers of false doctrine, but this was not an annoyance to him. It was a necessary safeguard.

Philippians 3:1

Finally, my brethren, rejoice in the Lord. To write the same things to you, to me indeed is not grievous, but for you it is safe.

The first danger he addresses came from legalists who taught that righteousness (and therefore salvation) comes through the works of the law.

Philippians 3:2

² Beware of dogs, beware of evil workers, beware of the concision.

The Bible has nothing nice to say about dogs. Isaiah calls false prophets and shepherds "dumb dogs" and "greedy dogs" (Is. 56:10). This seems to be what Paul had in mind.

² Beware of dogs, beware of evil workers, beware of the concision.

These men were evil workers "because they neglected true works and did not teach the true use of them."

"He calls them concision [literally, a cutting off], because in urging circumcision, they cut off themselves and others from the Church."

Look out for the dogs, look out for the evil-workers, look out for those who mutilate the flesh.

The circumcision that God desires is not of the flesh, but of the heart and in the spirit.

Philippians 3:3

Romans 2:29

To worship God in the spirit is to worship him through Christ, and not through the works of the flesh.

Philippians 3:3

For we are the circumcision, which worship God in the spirit, and rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh.

To rejoice in Christ Jesus is to know that he is the captain of our salvation (Heb 2:10) and our hope of glory (Col 1:27).

We know that salvation is "not of works, lest any man should boast" (Eph 2:9).

Philippians 3:3

For we are the circumcision, which worship God in the spirit, and rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh.

Paul now shows that he uniquely qualified to speak on this subject. Before he came to Christ, he could boast about all the things the Jews most highly esteemed.

Philippians 3:4-6

- ⁴ Though I might also have confidence in the flesh. If any other man thinketh that he hath whereof he might trust in the flesh, I more:
- of the stock of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, an Hebrew of the Hebrews; as touching the law, a Pharisee;
- ⁶ Concerning zeal, persecuting the church; touching the righteousness which is in the law, blameless.

Having come to Christ, he now knew this was all empty gain. The only pursuit he valued was the knowledge of Christ.

Philippians 3:7-8

- But what things were gain to me, those I counted loss for Christ.
- Yea doubtless, and I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord:

for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and do count them but dung, that I may win Christ,

In the eyes of his peers, his sacrifice was profound. But he mourned his loss no more than one misses the digested remains of yesterday's meal.

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- Yea doubtless, and I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord:

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Through the KNOWLEDGE of Christ he would WIN Christ, and reap the rewards of true wisdom:

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Proverbs 3:13-15

- ¹³ Happy is the man that findeth wisdom, and the man that getteth understanding.
- For the merchandise of it is better than the merchandise of silver, and the gain thereof than fine gold.
- 15 She is more precious than rubies: and all the things thou canst desire are not to be compared unto her.

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You find WISDOM when you find CHRIST!

1 Corinthians 1:24b

²⁴ ... Christ the power of God, and the wisdom of God.

Paul wanted to FIND Christ and be FOUND in Christ; hidden in the cleft of that great Rock.

Philippians 3:9

And be found in him, not having mine own righteousness, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of Christ, the righteousness which is of God by faith:

He did not want to be guilty of frustrating the grace of God.

Philippians 3:9

9 And be found in him, not having mine own righteousness, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of Christ, the righteousness which is of God by faith:


Galatians 2:21


I do not frustrate the grace of God: for if righteousness come by the law, then Christ is dead in vain.

There are wonderful treasures waiting to be discovered in the study of the Old Testament. However, we must be careful in our application of Judaic truths to Christianity. The greater truth is in the New Testament.

1 Timothy 1:5-7

- Now the end of the commandment is charity out of a pure heart, and of a good conscience, and of faith unfeigned:
- ⁶ From which some having swerved have turned aside unto vain jangling;
- Desiring to be teachers of the law; understanding neither what they say, nor whereof they affirm.





Chapter 2: PAUL'S APPEAL TO HAVE THE KNOWLEDGE OF CHRIST

Paul wanted to KNOW Christ in both his power and in his suffering, both as the great I AM and the Lamb of God.

Philippians 3:10-11

- That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death;
- 11 If by any means I might attain unto the resurrection of the dead.

The power of his resurrection is the power that changes lives.

Philippians 3:10-11

Acts 4:33

And with great power gave the apostles witness of the resurrection of the Lord Jesus: and great grace was upon them all.

This verse is worth a second look:

Philippians 3:10-11

- That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death;
- ¹¹ If by any means I might attain unto the resurrection of the dead.

Philippians 1:29

²⁹ For unto you it is given in the behalf of Christ, not only to believe on him, but also to suffer for his sake;

He was NOT suggesting that some people are resurrected and others are not. He knew that for ALL people, "there shall be a resurrection of the dead, both of the just and unjust" (Acts 24:15).

Philippians 3:10-11

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Paul wanted to fully die to Christ so that Christ might be fully formed in him.

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Galatians 2:20

I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.

Paul exposed the lie of the false teachers who claimed that Christians have already attained a state of perfection.

Philippians 3:12

Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect: but I follow after, if that I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ Jesus.

He pursued a Christ-like life. He wanted to grasp Jesus in the same way Jesus grasped him.

Philippians 3:12

Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect: but I follow after, if that I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ Jesus.

He knew he had not reached his goal. But he had abandoned his days of chasing righteousness by works, and now he was pursuing the perfection that comes only in Christ.

Philippians 3:13

¹³ Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before,

This may seem like TWO things, but you cannot do the first without doing the second.

Philippians 3:13

Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before,

He knew that every step of obedience brought him closer to Jesus than he was before.

Philippians 3:14

¹⁴ I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.

Now, just three verses after saying he was NOT perfect, Paul includes himself in a group of those who ARE perfect.

Philippians 3:15

Let us therefore, as many as be perfect, be thus minded: and if in any thing ye be otherwise minded, God shall reveal even this unto you.

But here, those who are perfect are those whose hope for final perfection is rooted in Christ.

The "otherwise minded" think they are already there.

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"There is present, then, a bit of irony:
perfect (mature) believers are those who admit they
are not perfect in any absolute sense."

As we seek his guidance, the Spirit of Truth helps us separate truth from error.

Philippians 3:15

Let us therefore, as many as be perfect, be thus minded: and if in any thing ye be otherwise minded, God shall reveal even this unto you.

We cannot wait for everyone to be in agreement on all things. We must move forward on those things we DO agree.

Philippians 3:16

Nevertheless, whereto we have already attained, let us walk by the same rule, let us mind the same thing.

- Whose end is destruction, whose God is their belly, and whose glory is in their shame, who mind earthly things.)

God forbid we should be "lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God" (2 Timothy 3:4).

Jesus did not suffer and die on the cross so that we could live for the pursuit of pleasure.

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
