The Book of Revelation is divided into these three parts.
It can also be divided by its STRUCTURE.

It begins with an **introduction**, and ends with a **conclusion**.

John writes of God's people on THIS earth and on the NEW earth.

His testimony centers on **14 visions** he saw of events related to “The Time of Jacobs Trouble” (also known as The Great Tribulation).

(C) Fourteen Visions	4:1 to 19:21
(B) God’s people on the New Earth	20:1 to 22:5

Here is a very important key to understanding the book of Revelation:

The events described in these 14 visions are NOT always told in sequential order (first *this*, then *this*, then *this*).

Some events happen simultaneously, at the same time.

Some visions are of things that have *already* happened, as a way of explanation.

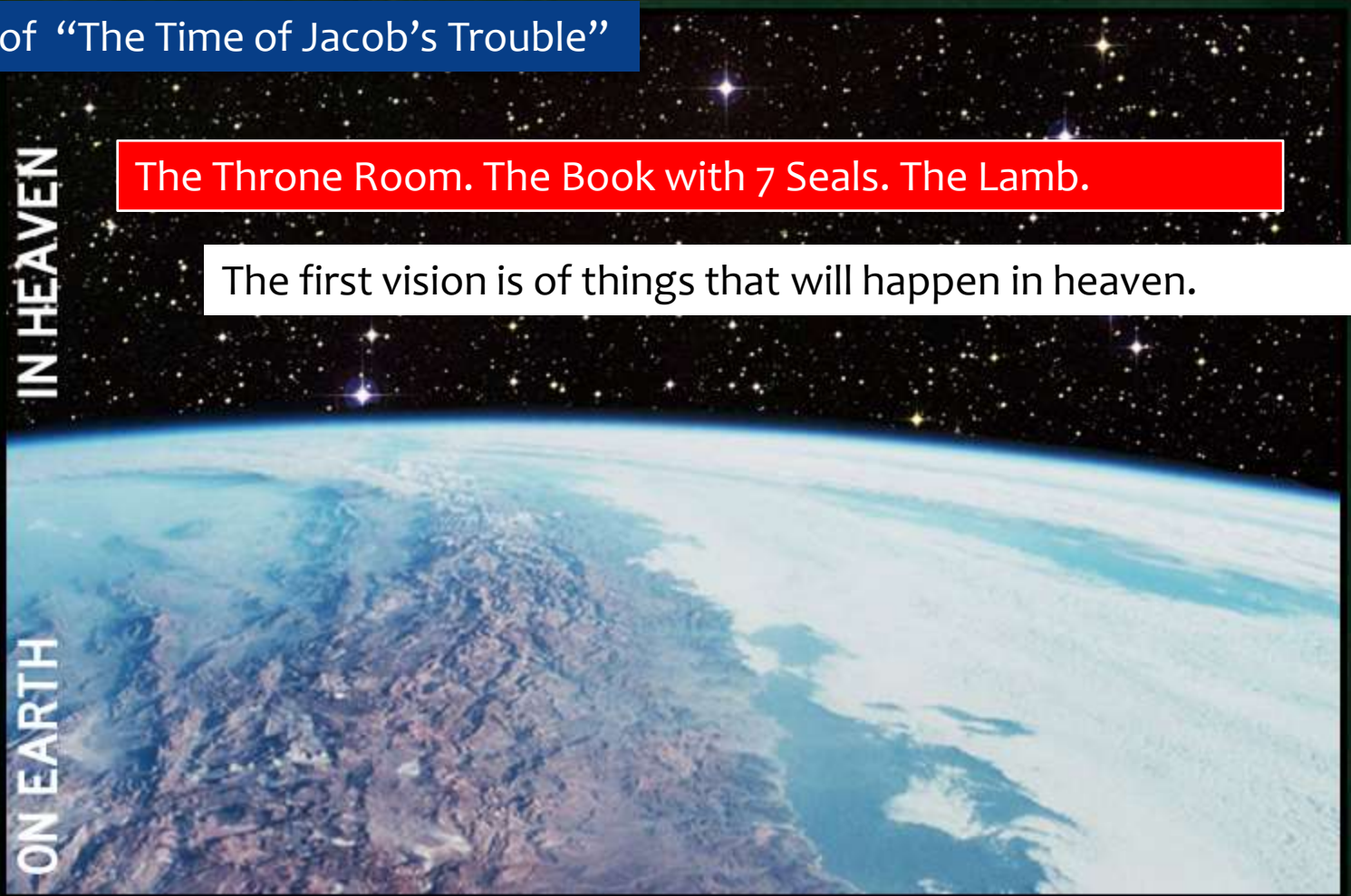



The First Vision: In Heaven

Revelation 4:1

- ¹ After this I looked, and, behold, a door was opened in heaven: and the first voice which I heard was as it were of a trumpet talking with me; which said, Come up hither, and I will shew thee things which must be hereafter.



Revelation 4:2-3a

- 2 And immediately I was in the spirit:
and, behold, a throne was set in
heaven, and one sat on the throne.
- 3 And he that sat was to look upon
like a jasper and a sardine stone:



Revelation 4:3b-4

³ and *there was* a rainbow round about the throne, in sight like unto an emerald.

⁴ And round about the throne were four and twenty seats:

and upon the seats I saw four and twenty elders sitting, clothed in white raiment;

and they had on their heads crowns of gold.



WHO ARE THE 24 ELDERS?

“Some people believe these 24 elders represent Israel, but at the time of this vision, Israel as a whole nation had not yet been redeemed.

The elders cannot represent tribulation saints for the same reason – not all had yet been converted at the time of John’s vision.

The most likely option is that the elders represent the raptured Church which sings songs of redemption. They wear the crowns of victory and have gone to the place prepared for them by their Redeemer.”

Revelation 4:5

5 And out of the throne proceeded lightnings and thunderings and voices:

and *there were seven lamps of fire burning before the throne, which are the seven Spirits of God.*





Revelation 4:6a

And before the throne *there was* a sea of glass like unto crystal:

Revelation 4:6b

⁶ ...and in the midst of the throne,
and round about the throne,
were four beasts full of eyes
before and behind.



Revelation 4:7

⁷ And the first beast *was* like a lion, and the second beast like a calf, and the third beast had a face as a man, and the fourth beast *was* like a flying eagle.



Revelation 4:8

⁸ And the four beasts had each of them six wings about *him*; and *they* were full of eyes within: and they rest not day and night, saying,

Holy, holy, holy,
Lord God Almighty,
which was, and is, and is to come.



Revelation 4:9-11

- ⁹ And when those beasts give glory and honour and thanks to him that sat on the throne, who liveth for ever and ever,
- ¹⁰ The four and twenty elders fall down before him that sat on the throne, and worship him that liveth for ever and ever, and cast their crowns before the throne, saying,
- ¹¹ Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created.



Revelation 4:9-11

- ⁹ And when those beasts give glory and honour and thanks to him that sat on the throne, who liveth for ever and ever,
- ¹⁰ The four and twenty elders fall down before him that sat on the throne, and worship him that liveth for ever and ever, and cast their crowns before the throne, saying,
- ¹¹ Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created.

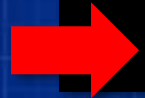

- 2 And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice,
Who is worthy to open the book,
and to loose the seals thereof?

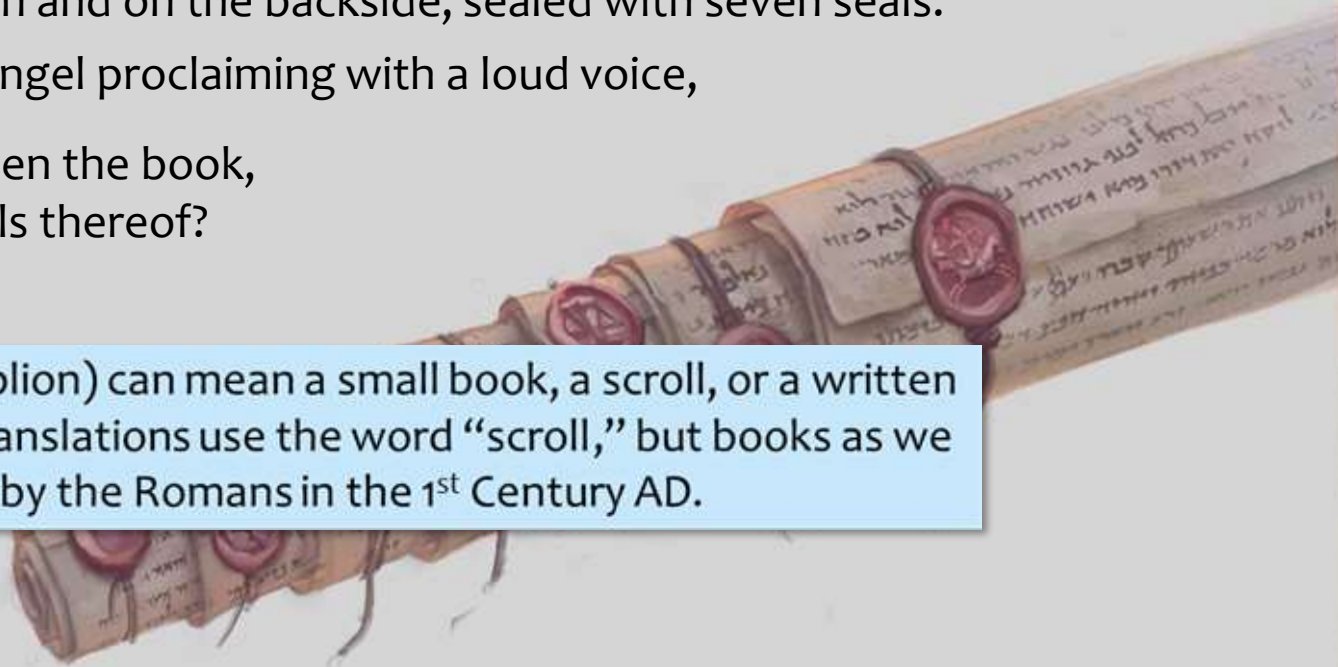


The First Vision: In Heaven

Revelation 5:1-2

- 1 And I saw in the right hand of him that sat on the throne a **book** written within and on the backside, sealed with seven seals.
- 2 And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice,
Who is worthy to open the book,
and to loose the seals thereof?

The Greek word βιβλίον (biblion) can mean a small book, a scroll, or a written document. Most modern translations use the word “scroll,” but books as we know them were produced by the Romans in the 1st Century AD.



Revelation 5:3-4

- 3 And no man in heaven, nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open the book, neither to look thereon.
- 4 And I wept much, because no man was found worthy to open and to read the book, neither to look thereon.



Revelation 5:5

⁵ And one of the elders saith unto me,
Weep not:

behold, the Lion of the tribe of Juda,
the Root of David,
hath prevailed to open the book,
and to loose the seven seals thereof.



Revelation 5:6-7

- ⁶ And I beheld, and, lo, in the midst of the throne and of the four beasts, and in the midst of the elders, stood a Lamb as it had been slain, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven Spirits of God sent forth into all the earth.
- ⁷ And he came and took the book out of the right hand of him that sat upon the throne.



Revelation 5:8

⁸ And when he had taken the book, the four beasts and four *and* twenty elders fell down before the Lamb, having every one of them harps, and golden vials full of odours, which are the prayers of saints.



Revelation 5:9-10

- 9 And they sung a new song,
saying, Thou art worthy to take
the book, and to open the seals
thereof:
for thou wast slain, and hast
redeemed us to God by thy blood
out of every kindred, and tongue,
and people, and nation;
- 10 And hast made us unto our God
kings and priests:
and we shall reign on the earth.



Revelation 5:9-10

- 9 And they sung a new song, saying, Thou art worthy to take the book, and to open the seals thereof:
for thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us to God by thy blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation;
- 10 And hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign on the earth.



Here is more proof that the 24 elders represent the Raptured church.





Revelation 5:11-12

honour, and glory, and blessing.**
