


The first temple was built by Solomon and destroyed by the Babylonians.

King Cyrus of Persia allowed the Jews to rebuild it.



King Herod designed and built the second temple, the one that stood in the time of Christ. This temple was destroyed by the Romans. All that remains today is the Western Wall.




A third temple will be built during the first 3½ years of the antichrist's reign. This is the temple John is told to measure.

The Measuring of the Temple

Revelation 11:2

But the court which is without the temple leave out, and measure it not; for it is given unto the Gentiles:

and the holy city shall they tread under foot forty and two months.



The Measuring of the Temple

Revelation 11:2

But the court which is without the temple leave out, and measure it not; for it is given unto the Gentiles:

and the holy city shall they tread under foot forty and two months.

42 months = 3½ years.
This is the time appointed for the great tribulation.

After describing the measuring of the temple, John testifies of his vision of the two witnesses.



Revelation 11:3

And I will give power unto my two witnesses, and they shall prophesy a thousand two hundred and threescore days, clothed in sackcloth.

1,260 days also adds up to 3 ½ years.

Sackcloth:

This word is chiefly used in Scripture to denote a cloth or garment worn in mourning, distress, or shame.




Could the Two Witnesses be Enoch and Elijah?

Enoch and Elijah, as far as we know, are the only two individuals whom God has taken directly to heaven without experiencing death (Gen 5:23; 2 Kgs 2:11).

The fact that neither Enoch nor Elijah has yet experienced death – and Hebrews 9:27 says that ALL men are appointed to die once – seems to qualify them for the job of the two witnesses, who will be killed when their job is done.


In addition, both Enoch and Elijah were prophets who pronounced God's judgment.


- And Enoch also, the seventh from Adam, prophesied of these, saying, Behold, the Lord cometh with ten thousands of his saints,


Zechariah 4:2b-3

In Zechariah's day, the "two anointed ones" were the high priest Joshua and the governor Zerubbabel.

In the time of the antichrist, God uses the two witnesses of Revelation Chapter 11.

The two witnesses are anointed with special powers.

Revelation 11:5

5 And if any man will hurt them, fire proceedeth out of their mouth, and devoureth their enemies: and if any man will hurt them, he must in this manner be killed.



The two witnesses are anointed with special powers.

These have power to shut heaven, that it rain not in the days of their prophecy: and have power over waters to turn them to blood, and to smite the earth with all plagues, as often as they will.





Now John's testimony returns to the second 3½ years.



The second woe is past;and, behold,the third woe cometh quickly.

As a Reminder:

The 5th, 6th, and 7th trumpets announce "the three woes."

THE FIRST WOE:

Demonic locusts torment unbelievers for five months (9:1-12).

THE SECOND WOE:

1/3 of mankind are killed by fire, smoke, and brimstone (9:13-21).




