


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

This vision of "a great wonder in heaven" celebrates a promise that was fulfilled long before John's day – the Word was made flesh.

Isaiah 7:14
Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign;
Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.

This woman represents Israel.

She is "clothed with the sun" – with God's righteousness.

The 12 stars are her twelve tribes.

Her child is the Messiah, the Son of God.

To "travail in birth" is to labor in childbirth.

The woman's troubles began in Eden, as foretold by God:

The great red dragon is the devil.

His seven heads, ten horns, and seven crowns are symbols of his earthly dominion.

The vision goes from Christ's birth directly to his ascension.

And the woman fled into the wilderness, where she hath a place prepared of God, that they should feed her there a thousand two hundred and threescore days.

A "score" is twenty.

"Threescore" is 3 times 20, for a total of 60.

A thousand two hundred and threescore = 1,200 + 60

A biblical year lasts 360 days. A half year is 180 days. $1260 \text{ days} = 3\frac{1}{2} \text{ years} (360 + 360 + 360 + 180)$

Between verses 5 and 6 is the Church age.

The Church is not in this vision because the Bride of Christ is not subject to the time of great tribulation. The church has been "delivered from the wrath to come" (1 Thess. 1:10).

Verse 3 said the dragon's tail "drew the third part of the stars of heaven, and did cast them to the earth," but here it is clear that Satan and his angels were cast out together.






Satan is "the prince of the power of the air" (Eph. 2:2). This word air comes from the Greek aer meaning "the atmospheric region." Satan was cast out of heaven and into the regions of earth.

This prophecy celebrates Christ's victory over Satan. Those who belong to the Lord are secured by him, but woe to those who are on their own!

This is very similar to what we read in verse 6:

In the days of Moses, God used eagles' wings to bring Jerusalem out of Egypt.

Flood waters are often symbolic of mighty enemies.

Jeremiah 46:8

Egypt riseth up like a flood, and his waters are moved like the rivers; and he saith, I will go up, and will cover the earth; I will destroy the city and the inhabitants thereof.

In the book of Numbers, when "the earth opened her mouth," it was a great earthquake.

Numbers 16:31-32
