



Noah | Ham | Cush | Nimrod


#### Genesis 10:8-10

Nimrod means "Let us rebel."






Babel means "confusion".






In Daniel 7, the "dreadful and terrible" beast led by "the little horn" represents the resurrected Roman empire ruled by the antichrist.



It is also the feet of iron and clay that is the final part of the image in Nebuchadnezzar's dream.

Chapter 17 looks at the partnership of the whore and the beast she rides.

The Word of God consistently describes the sin of idolatry in sexual terms.

The Bible represents God's relationship to his people as a marriage.

#### 2 Corinthians 11:2

For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy: for I have espoused you to one husband, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ.

It is an act of betrayal and (spiritual) fornication for God's beloved to be joined to idols.

We see this in the condemnation of King Jehoram of Judah:

#### 2 Chronicles 21:11

Moreover he made high places in the mountains of Judah, and caused the inhabitants of Jerusalem to commit fornication, and compelled Judah thereto.

#### **HIGH PLACES**

"Before the temple was built in Jerusalem, sacrifices were offered to Jehovah by his worshipers, on high places; but afterwards such mounds were devoted to idolatrous sacrifices." Webster's Dictionary

#### 2 Chronicles 21:11

<sup>11</sup> Moreover he made **high places** in the mountains of Judah, and caused the inhabitants of Jerusalem to commit fornication, and compelled Judah *thereto*.

#### **HIGH PLACES**

This term is found only once in the New Testament. It refers to any center of idolatrous worship.

## Ephesians 6:12

12 For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.

In this very explicit passage from Ezekiel, Israel's unfaithfulness to God is likened to an promiscuous wife with an unquenchable lust for new lovers.

# Ezekiel 16:25-26, 28-29

- <sup>25</sup> Thou hast built **thy high place** at every head of the way, and hast made thy beauty to be abhorred, and hast opened thy feet to every one that passed by, and multiplied thy whoredoms.
- <sup>26</sup> Thou hast also committed fornication with the Egyptians thy neighbours, great of flesh; and hast increased thy whoredoms, to provoke me to anger.
- <sup>28</sup> Thou hast played the whore also with the Assyrians, because thou wast unsatiable; yea, thou hast played the harlot with them, and yet couldest not be satisfied.
- <sup>29</sup> Thou hast moreover multiplied thy fornication in the land of Canaan unto Chaldea; and yet thou wast not satisfied herewith.

Israel was worse than a prostitute because she paid her lovers to give her pleasure.

## Ezekiel 16:33

33 They give gifts to all whores: but thou givest thy gifts to all thy lovers, and hirest them, that they may come unto thee on every side for thy whoredom.



The whore herself is not interested in sensual pleasure. She trades her virtue for money.

She is "the strange woman" who lures the foolish and ignorant to destruction.

## Proverbs 5:3-4

- For the lips of a strange woman drop as an honeycomb, and her mouth is smoother than oil:
- <sup>4</sup> But her end is bitter as wormwood, sharp as a twoedged sword.

She is "the mistress of witchcrafts" who brings destruction to nations and families through her whoredoms.

#### Nahum 3:3-4

- The horseman lifteth up both the bright sword and the glittering spear: and there is a multitude of slain, and a great number of carcases;
  - they stumble upon their corpses:

wellfavoured harlot, the mistress of witchcrafts, that selleth nations through her whoredoms, and families through her witchcrafts.

The meaning of this phrase is given later in the chapter, but it useful to see it now:

## Revelation 17:15


The waters which thou sawest, where the whore sitteth, are peoples, and multitudes, and nations, and tongues.

Her customers come from around the world and all parts of society – royals and commoners, rich and poor, educated and unschooled.

In verse 3, the focus turns from the woman to the beast she rides.

The beast empowers and promotes the whore.

# A Dictionary of Bible Types

"Scarlet is used to describe the stain of sin in contrast with the white garments of salvation."





In John's life, the Roman Empire (the legs of iron) was in power.


<sup>10</sup> And there are seven kings:

This is the feet of iron and clay; the ten-horned beast, the world order that is in place when the antichrist comes into power.

"He is **of** the seven in that he is the culmination of all the previous, pagan, idolatrous empires. But he will go into perdition, the lake of fire."



As Chapter 17 comes to the close, John gives further insight into the identity of the whore of Babylon:

She is not only the idolatrous system. She is the city from which it governs.



After the fall of the Western Roman Empire in 476, the Roman Catholic Church became a powerful social and political institution, and its influence spread throughout Europe and the world.



The Pope is not only the head of the Roman Catholic church. The Pope is the king of the Vatican City State.

The papal church of Rome is the oldest continuing monarchy in the world.




