

First, Paul will prove that all people deserve to be condemned by God.

This section also has three divisions.

3) The Conclusion: All are Guilty Before God	(3:9-20)

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The Jews are the children of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. The Gentiles are everyone else.

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1) The Guilt of the Gentile	(1:18-32)

This is the subject of today's lesson.

#### Romans 1:18-19

- 18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who hold the truth in unrighteousness;
- <sup>19</sup> Because that which may be known of God is manifest in them; for God hath shewed it unto them.

Paul begins this section by explaining the reason for God's anger toward sinful man.

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## **Strong's Analytical Concordance**

The wrath of God is "his anger exhibited in punishment."

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God's wrath is as much a part of his nature as his love.

## John 3:36

He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him.

#### Romans 1:18-19

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God's wrath is directed at the ungodliness and unrighteousness of sinful man.

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# Webster's 1828 Dictionary

#### **UNGODLINESS:**

Impiety; wickedness; disregard of God and his commands and neglect of his worship.

The ungodly deny there is anything holy.

## Romans 1:18-19

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## Webster's 1828 Dictionary

#### **UNRIGHTEOUSNESS:**

a violation of the divine law, or of the plain principles of justice and equity; when applied to persons, it denotes an habitual course of wickedness.

The unrighteous deny there is right and wrong.

#### Romans 1:18-19

- For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who hold the truth in unrighteousness;
- Because that which may be known of God is manifest in them; for God hath shewed it unto them.

To hold the truth in unrighteousness is to keep yourself from seeing the truth because you don't want to see how wicked you really are.



#### Romans 1:18-19

- For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who hold the truth in unrighteousness;
- <sup>9</sup> Because that which may be known of God is manifest in them; for God hath shewed it unto them.

Man may try to hide himself from God, but God does not hide himself from man. Every day and night we see proof of God's existence.



#### Romans 1:18-19

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## Psalm 19:1-3

- The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament sheweth his handywork.
- Day unto day uttereth speech, and night unto night sheweth knowledge.
- <sup>3</sup> There is no speech nor language, where their voice is not heard.

#### Romans 1:20-21

For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead;

so that they are without excuse:

Because that, when they knew God, they glorified him not as God, neither were thankful; but became vain in their imaginations, and their foolish heart was darkened. Anyone who fails to give thanks and praise to God is without excuse – even if he has never heard a preacher. The creation itself proves the power and supremacy of the Creator.

#### Romans 1:20-21

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- Because that, when they knew God, they glorified him not as God, neither were thankful; but became vain in their imaginations, and their foolish heart was darkened.

When people refuse to give God the glory and thanksgiving he deserves, their hearts turns dark, and their imaginations are filled with wicked ideas.

#### Romans 1:22-25

- <sup>22</sup> Professing themselves to be wise, they became fools,
- <sup>23</sup> And changed the glory of the uncorruptible God into an image made like to corruptible man, and to birds, and fourfooted beasts, and creeping things.
- Wherefore God also gave them up to uncleanness through the lusts of their own hearts, to dishonour their own bodies between themselves:
- <sup>25</sup> Who changed the truth of God into a lie, and worshipped and served the creature more than the Creator, who is blessed for ever. Amen.

Just as Paul wrote to Timothy, when men "turn away their ears from the truth, they shall be turned to fables" (2 Tim. 4:4).

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First, they change God into a creature from their own world.

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Then they change the truth of God into a lie.

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When people will not give God the praise and thanks he deserves ...
When they say that they are free to live any way they desire ...

God's response is not to weep and howl. He simply "gives them up."

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- Who changed the truth of God into a lie, and worshipped and served the creature more than the Creator, who is blessed for ever. Amen.



God gives them up to uncleanness.

## Romans 1:26-27

- <sup>26</sup> For this cause God gave them up unto vile affections:
  - for even their women did change the natural use into that which is against nature:
- <sup>27</sup> And likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust one toward another; men with men working that which is unseemly, and receiving in themselves that recompence of their error which was meet.



He also gives them up to vile (evil) affections:

## Romans 1:26-27

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Today's society wants you to believe that "love is love."
But God calls this "vile affections."

#### Romans 1:26-27

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"... and as a result of this sin, they suffered within themselves the penalty they deserved." New Living Translation

#### Romans 1:28

And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not convenient;

Lastly, God gives them over to a reprobate mind – a mind lost to virtue or grace; abandoned in sin.

#### Romans 1:28

#### **Geneva Bible Notes**

"They, having almost no more remorse for sin, run headlong into all types of evil."

#### Romans 1:29-31

- Peing filled with all unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, debate, deceit, malignity; whisperers,
- <sup>30</sup> Backbiters, haters of God, despiteful, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents,
- Without understanding, covenantbreakers, without natural affection, implacable, unmerciful:

Without God to govern him, man is merely a slave to sin's worst desires.

#### Romans 1:29-31

- <sup>29</sup> Being filled with all unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, debate, deceit, malignity; whisperers,
- <sup>30</sup> Backbiters, haters of God, despiteful, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents,
- Without understanding, covenantbreakers, without natural affection, implacable, unmerciful:

Implacable = will not be pacified or appeased.

(The boy was implacable and not willing to accept his former friend's apology.)

#### Romans 1:32

Who knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them.

This is the arrogance – and the condemnation – of the person who will not bow to God.

#### Romans 1:32

Who knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them.
