¹ Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: In the previous lesson, we learned that in order to be made righteous, we had to be justified – washed from the stain of sin.

Now, Paul shows us seven benefits of our justification in Christ and the righteousness we have been given.







Tribulation worketh patience; And patience, experience; and experience, hope:

Romans 5:5

⁵ And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us. Soon we will know that our hope was not in vain. Until then, we have the inner witness of God's love given to us by the Holy Spirit.

God's wrath is his righteous anger against sin. It will be on display when Jesus returns to judge the world.
