A | No condemnation for those who are in Christ, and the reason.

(1--4)

B | The Spirit (the new nature) in us; now leading us.

(5-15)

As the adopted sons of God, we can now be led by the new spirit in us.

ROMANS 8

That spirit is led by the Holy Spirit.

B | The Holy Spirit's witness with our spirit or new nature, leading it. (16-27)

Romans 8:16

¹⁶ The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God:

All humanity are the children of Adam, but the children of God are those he adopts for himself.

Because we are the children of God, we will share in Christ's eternal inheritance.

The Geneva Bible Notes list nine points from Romans 8 that it calls Our Fountains of Comfort:

(I revised these points to make them simpler and easier to understand.)

- ²¹ Because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God.

Our Fountains of Comfort

4. The curse on the earth will be broken, and all creation will be renewed.

The next verses are a little hard to understand in the King James Version.

Romans 8:19-21

- ¹⁹ For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the manifestation of the sons of God.
- For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of him who hath subjected the same in hope,
- ²¹ Because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God.

Here, the word creature does not refer to the new creature in Christ, but rather, to the Creation – the physical world.

- ²⁰ For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of him who hath subjected *the same* in hope,
- ²¹ Because the [creation] itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God.

When Christ returns, he will restore the natural world to its original condition and beauty.

Romans 8:19-21

- For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of him who hath subjected the same in hope,
- ²¹ Because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God.

These verses are easier to understand in the New Living Translation:

- 19 For all creation is waiting eagerly for that future day when God will reveal who his children really are.
- ²⁰ Against its will, all creation was subjected to God's curse.
 - But with eager hope,
- the creation looks forward to the day when it will join God's children in glorious freedom from death and decay.

Romans 8:22

²² For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now.


Ever since the fall of man, the creation has been sick with sin.

Travail is pain, anguish or suffering resulting from mental or physical hardship.







True believers also groan for the day when our struggles are over and we are forever with the Lord.

Romans 8:23

²³ And not only *they*, but ourselves also, which have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption, *to wit*, the redemption of our body.

But for now, our promised reward is out of sight. As Matthew Henry said, "Those that will deal with God must deal upon trust."

Romans 8:24-25

- For we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for?
- 25 But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it.

Romans 8:26a

Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities:
 for we know not what we should pray for as we ought:

As we go through this life, we are often unsure of what we should be praying for.

- 26 ... but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.
- ²⁷ And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what *is* the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to *the will of* God.



- 9 Behold, the Lord GOD will help me; who is he that shall condemn me? lo, they all shall wax old as a garment; the moth shall eat them up.




