We show our devotion to God by keeping the two great commandments:

Matthew 22:37-39

- God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.
- ³⁸ This is the first and great commandment.
- ³⁹ And the second *is* like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.

We show our devotion to God by keeping the two great commandments:

Romans 12 gives us instruction on keeping these commandments in the Christian era.

Matthew 22:37-39

- 37 ... Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.
- ³⁸ This is the first and great commandment.
- ³⁹ And the second *is* like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.

Paul now speaks to the entire church of Christ, both Jews and Gentiles.


