The World before Abraham











DAYS ONE AND TWO

The first 2,000 years of the Bible story are told in the first 11 chapters of Genesis.




The first 2,000 years of the Bible story are told in the first 11 chapters of Genesis. Look for yourself and see – this is only a few pages!





These two 1,000-year days focus on the two fathers of mankind, Adam and Noah.







The story of NOAH and the second 1,000 years is told in Genesis 6 to 11.

The book of Genesis is a book of beginnings and GENERATIONS.

Now these *are* the generations of Terah...


"The generations of Adam" are listed in Genesis 5. All these men were born in the first millennial day.





























The generations of Noah and his sons are recorded in Genesis 6, 10, and 11.




Noah was a just man and perfect in his generations, and Noah walked with God.

¹⁰ And Noah begat three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth.



Now these are the generations of the sons of Noah, Shem, Ham, and Japheth: and unto them were sons born after the flood.






The generations of SHEM are particularly important because he is in the line of Christ.

- 36 ...which was *the son* of Sem, which was *the son* of Noe, which was *the son* of Lamech,
- Which was the son of Mathusala, which was the son of Enoch, which was the son of Jared, which was the son of Maleleel, which was the son of Cainan,
- Which was the son of Enos, which was the son of Seth, which was the son of Adam, which was the son of God.



The generations of Shem are listed in both Genesis 10 and 11:

Chapter 10 lists all of Shem's sons including Arphaxad and his progeny down to Peleg.
