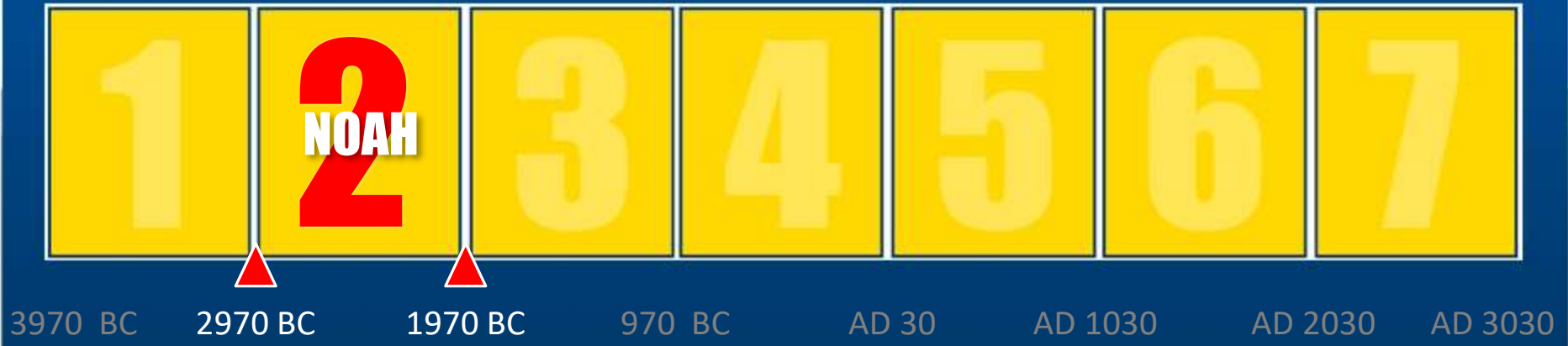
These two 1,000-year days focus on the two fathers of mankind, Adam and Noah.

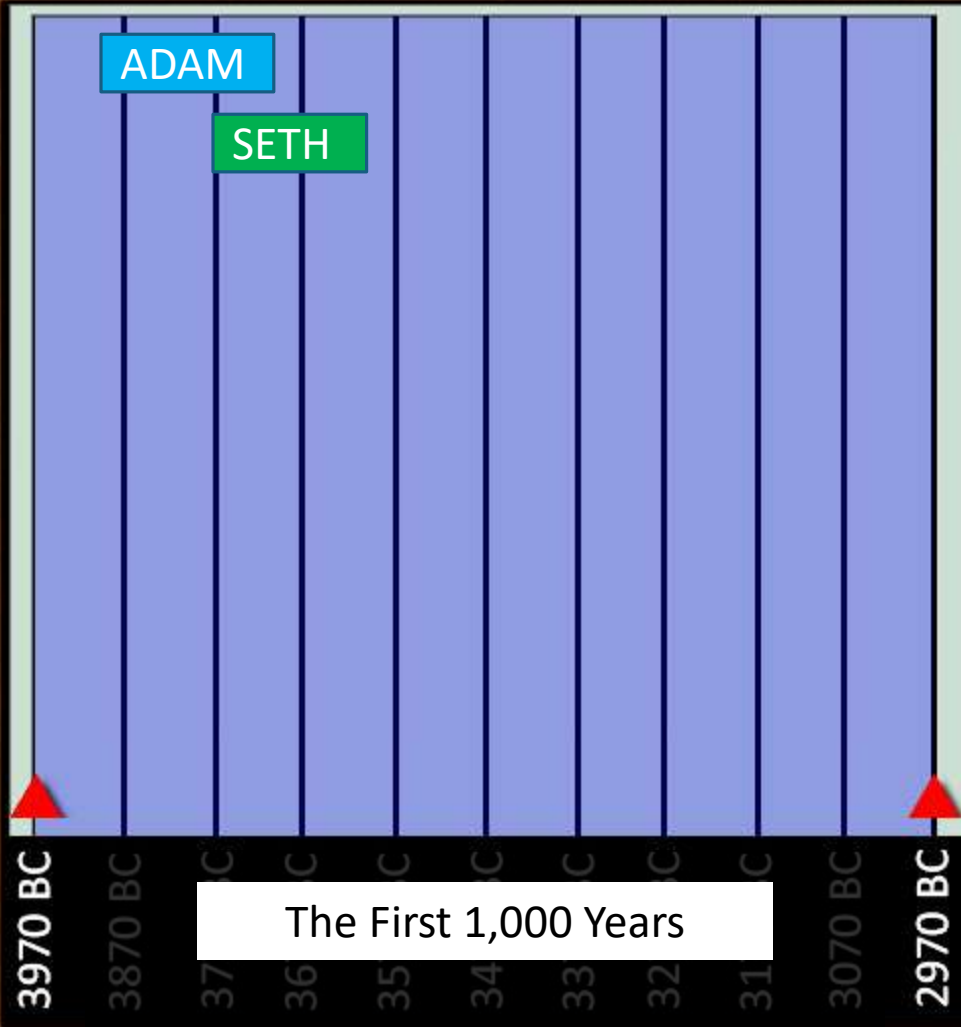

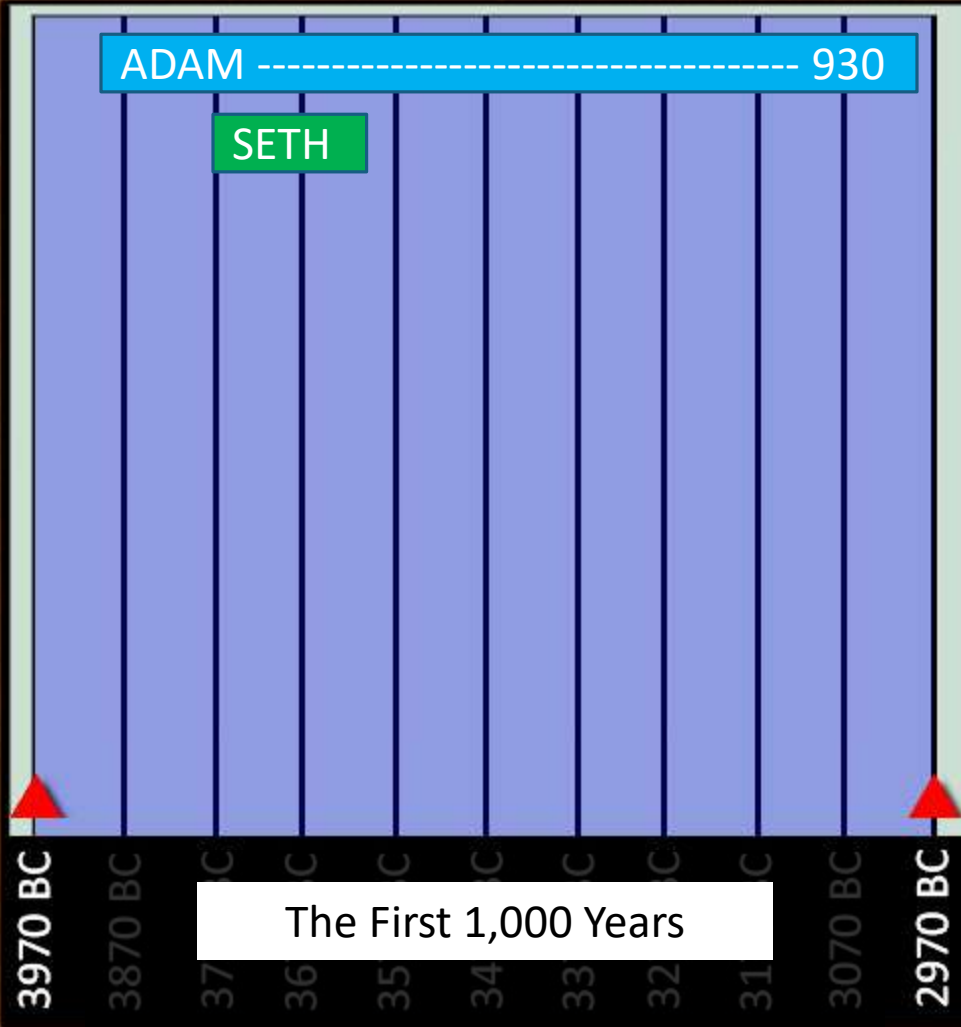
The First 1,000 Years

- ² Male and female created he them; and blessed them, and called their name Adam, in the day when they were created.



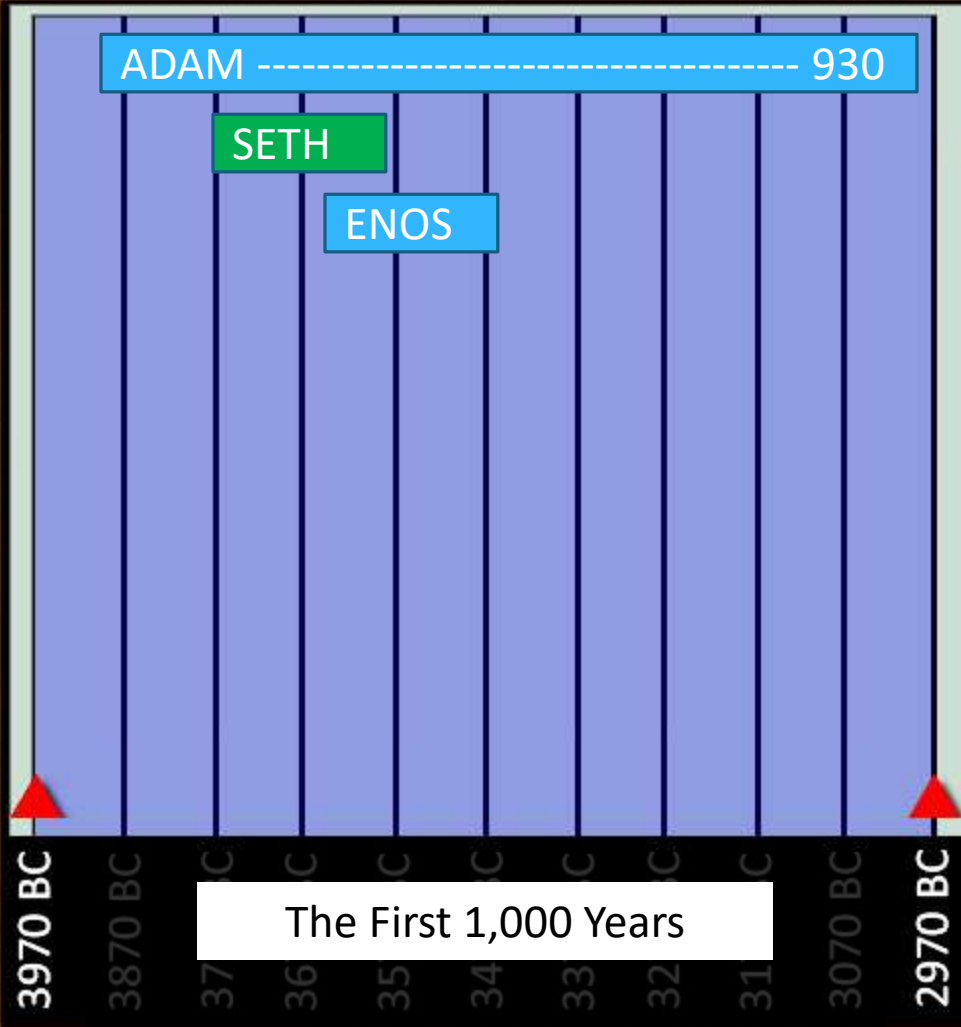

Genesis 5:22-24

²⁴ And Enoch walked with God: and he was not; for God took him.

It is common to hear after someone's death that God "took him." This detracts from the wonder of this account. **Enoch did not die**, but in his 365th year, God transported him into the spiritual realm. In all of recorded Bible history, Enoch's experience has only been duplicated by Elijah.

Genesis 5:23-24

⁵ By faith Enoch was translated that he should not see death; and was not found, because God had translated him: for before his translation he had this testimony, that he pleased God.

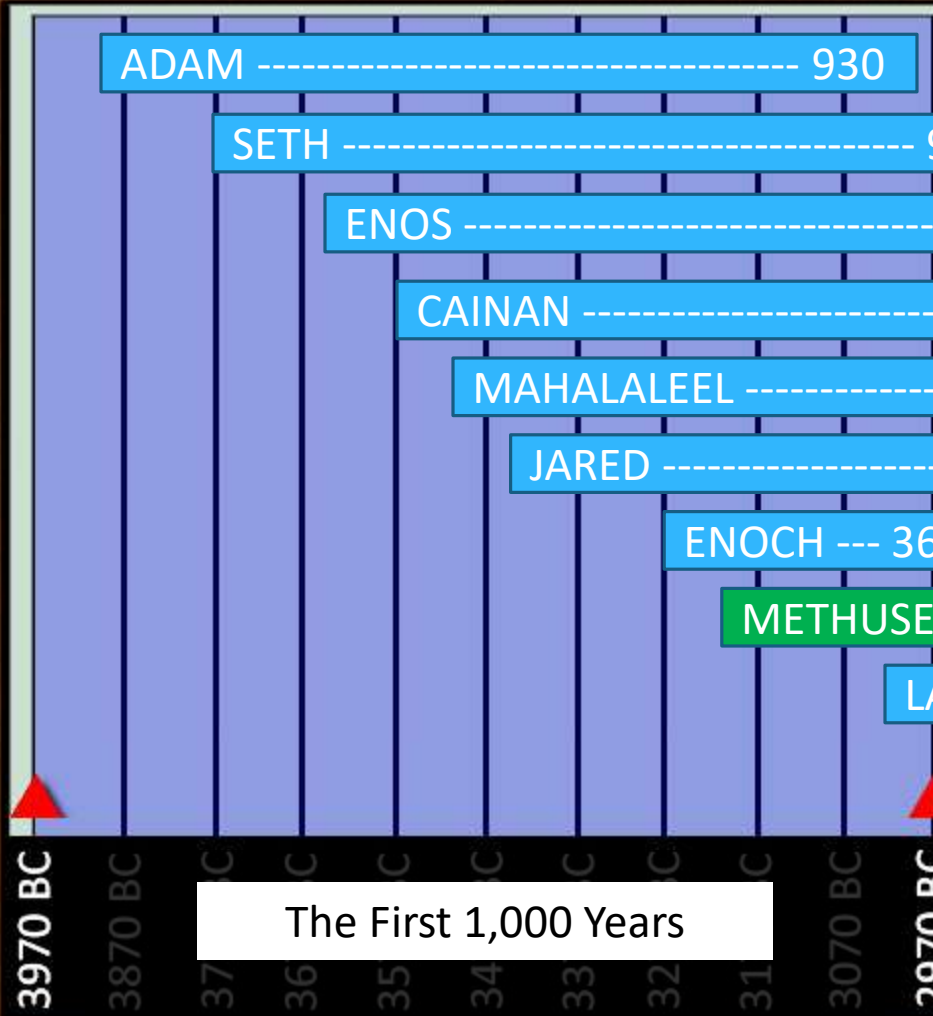


It is also remarkable that only seven generations from Adam, this man prophesied of Christ's return to judge the earth.

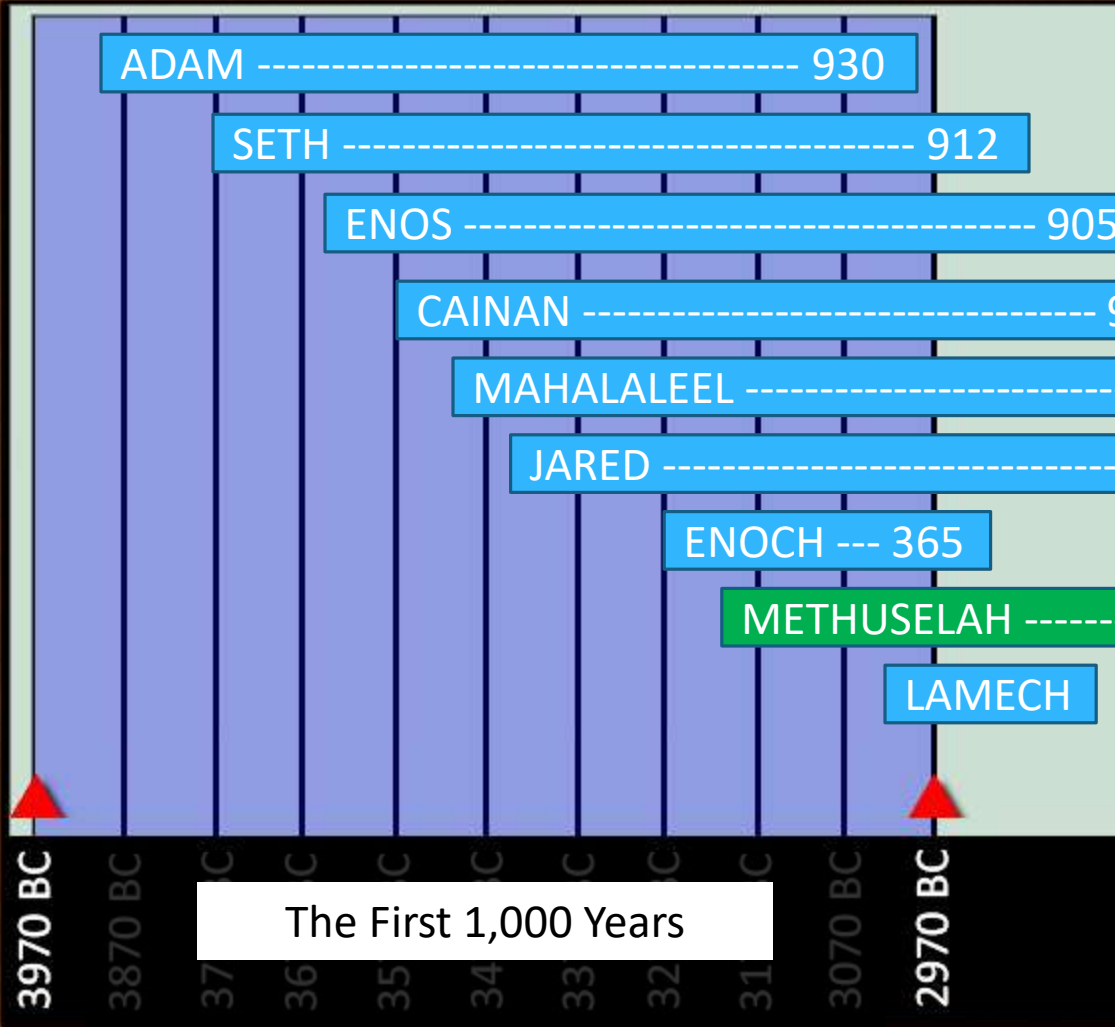
- ¹⁴ And Enoch also, the seventh from Adam, prophesied of these, saying, Behold, the Lord cometh with ten thousands of his saints,

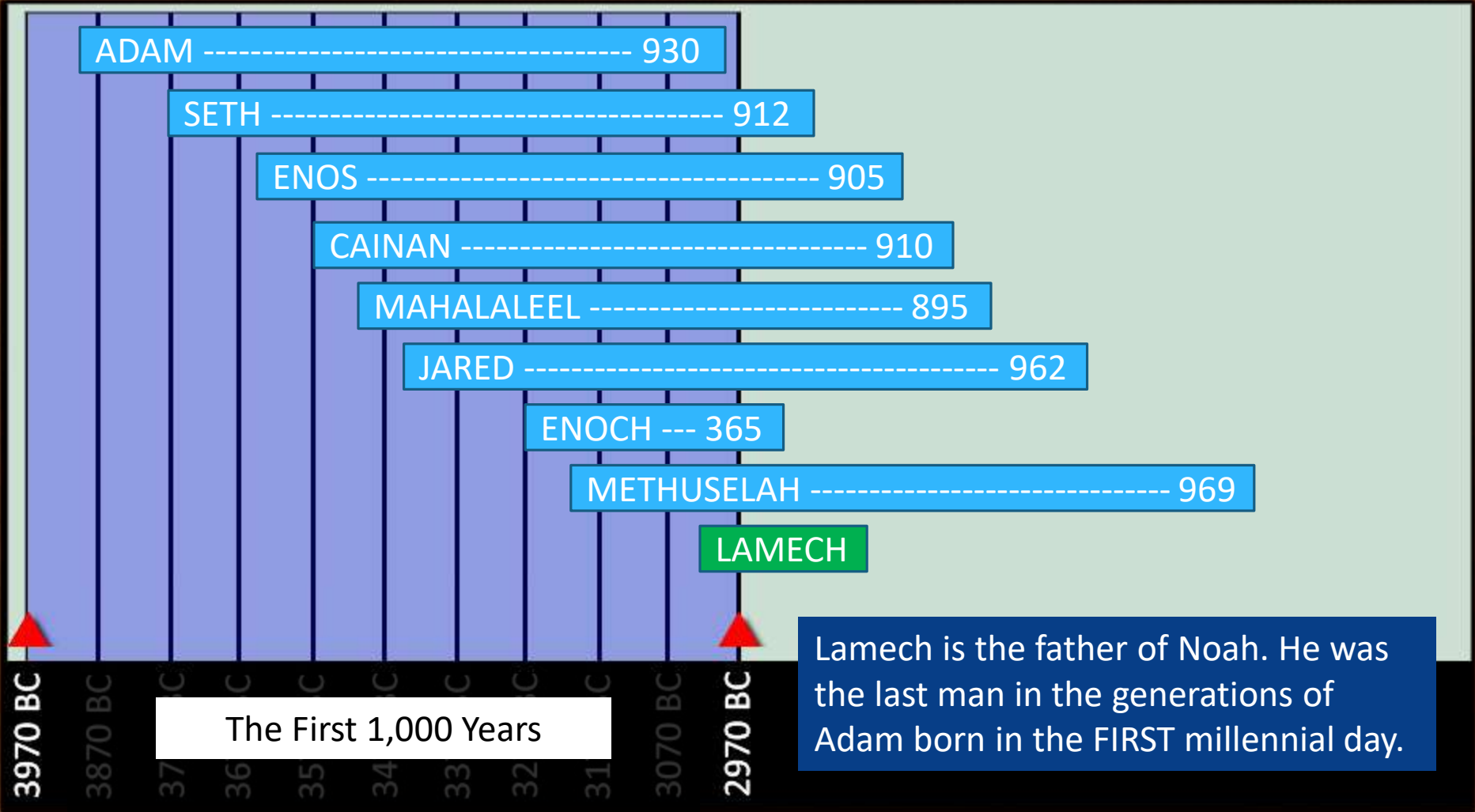

 25 And Methuselah lived an hundred eighty and seven years, and begat Lamech:

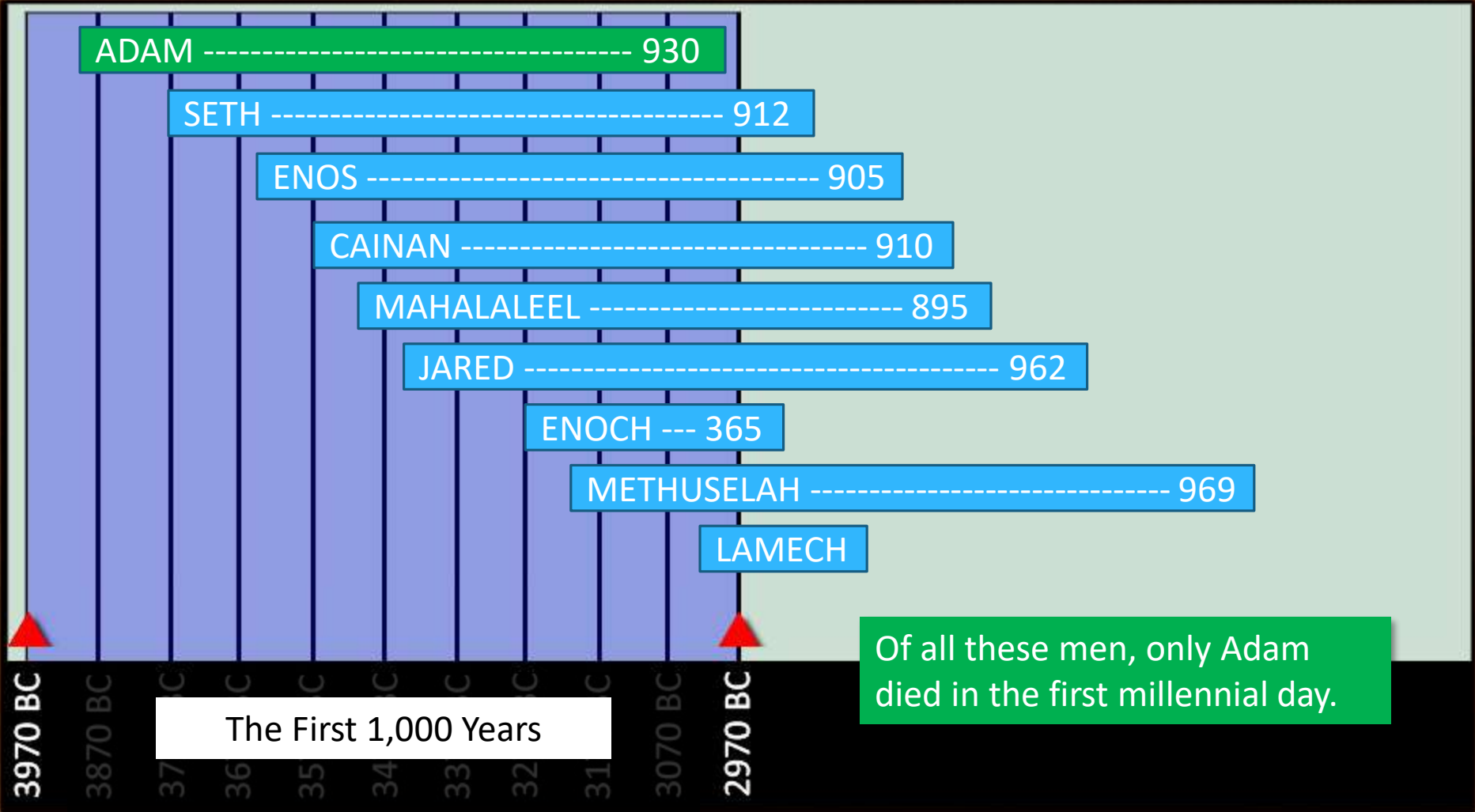

²⁷ And all the days of Methuselah were 969 years: and he died.



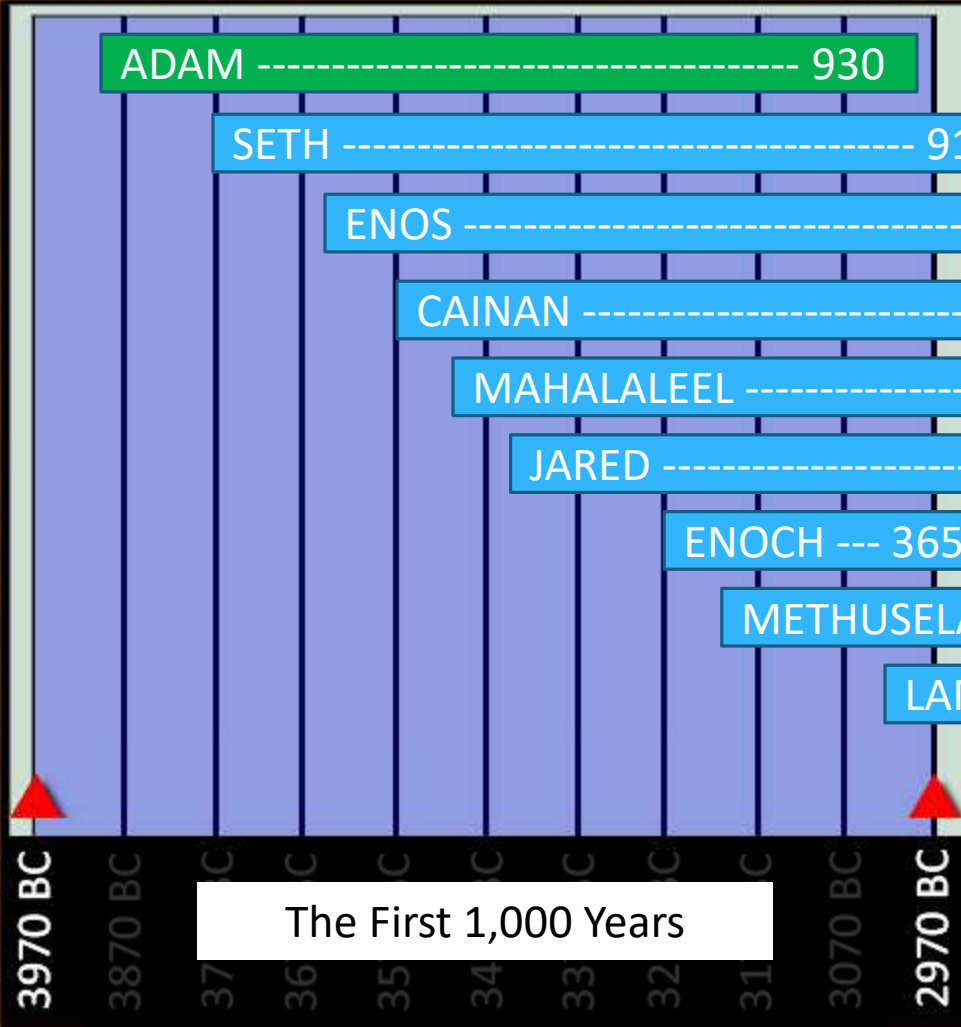
The First 1,000 Years

Lamech is the father of Noah. He was the last man in the generations of Adam born in the FIRST millennial day.

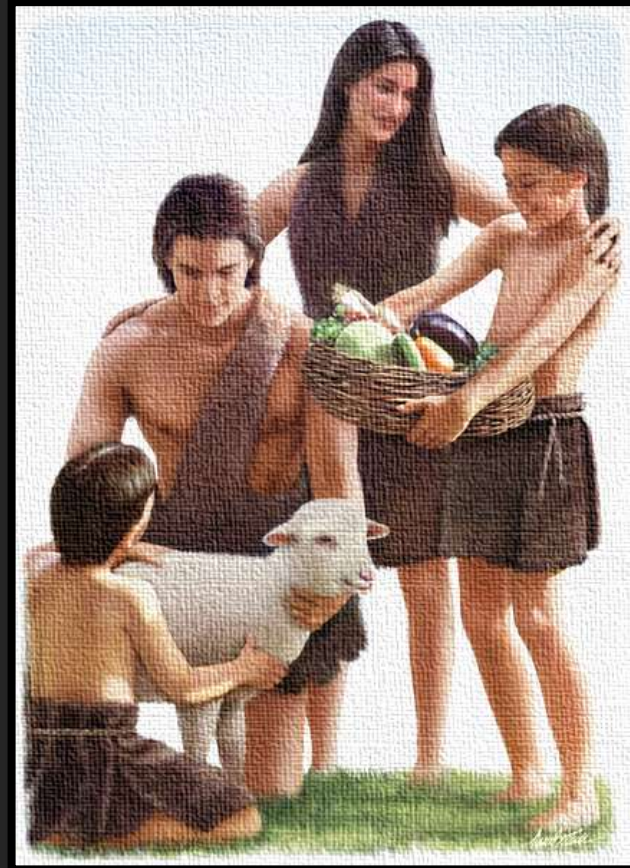

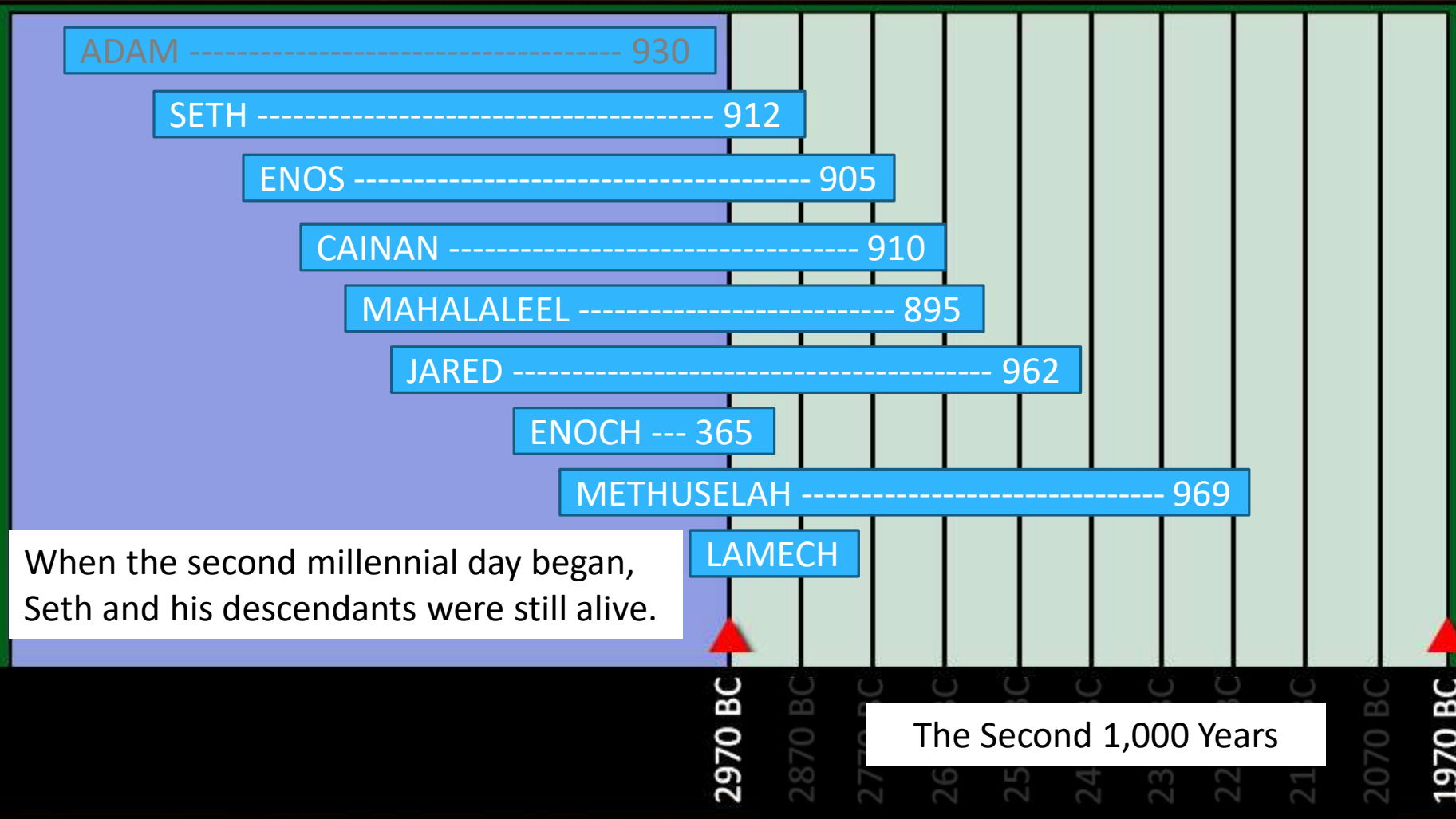

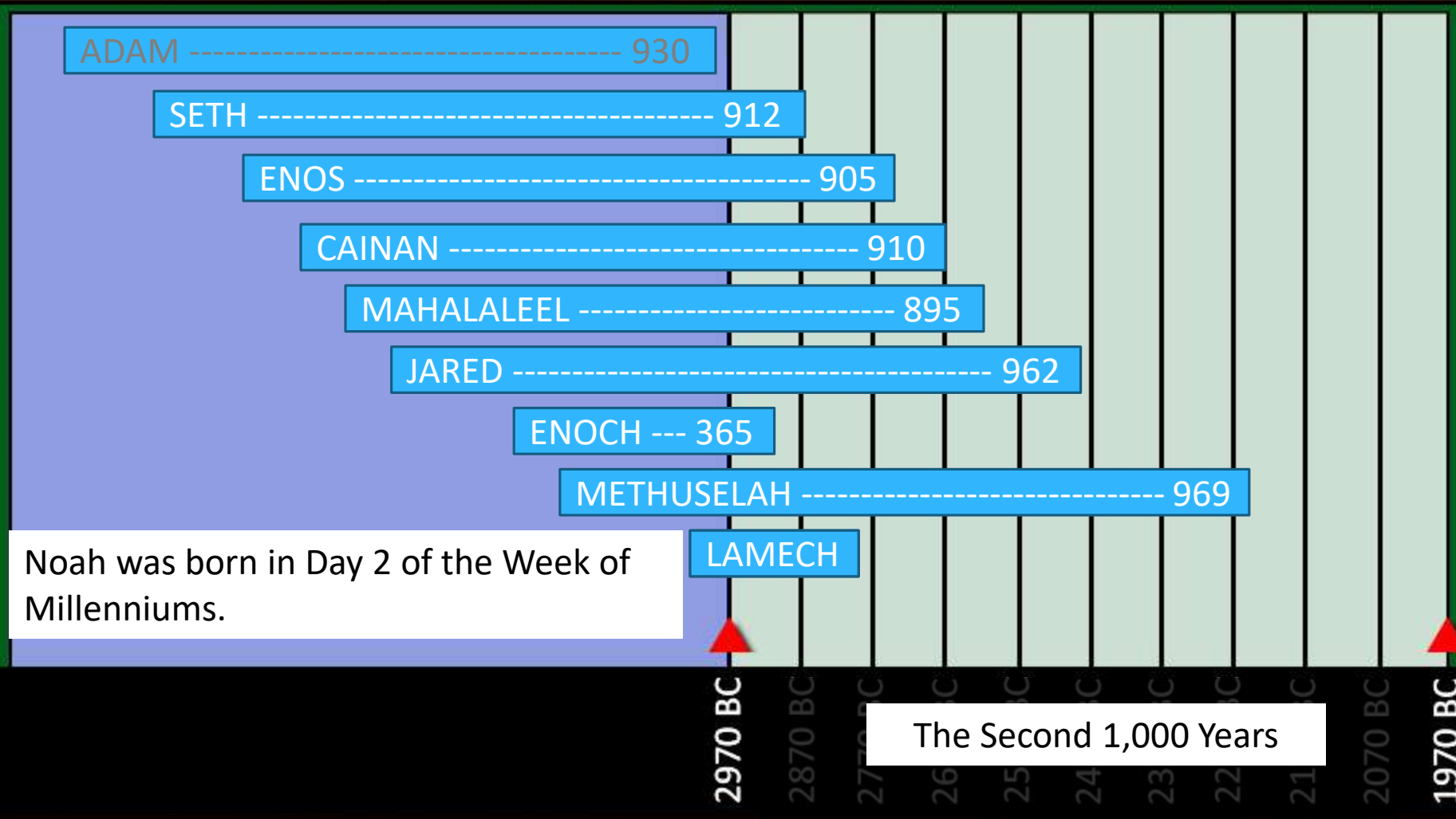
The story of **NOAH** and the second 1,000 years is told in Genesis 6 to 11.

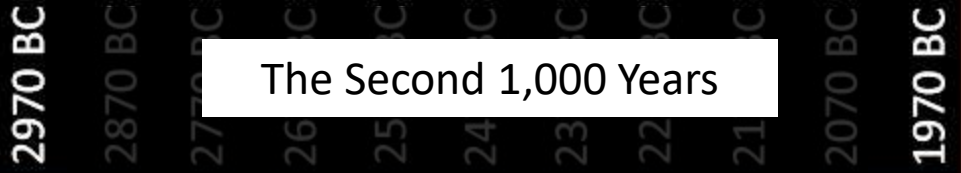

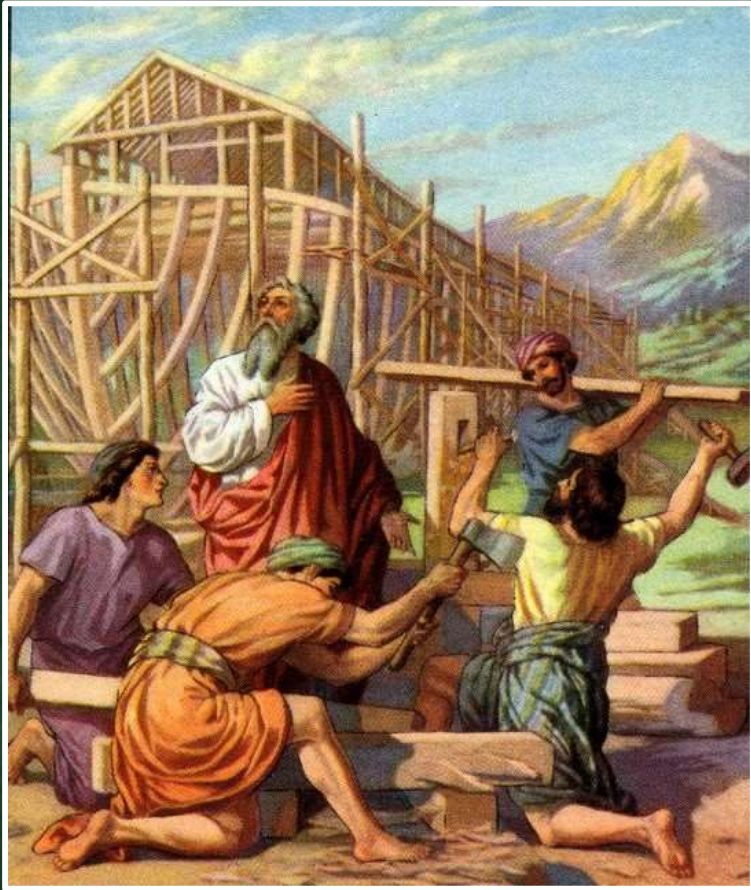

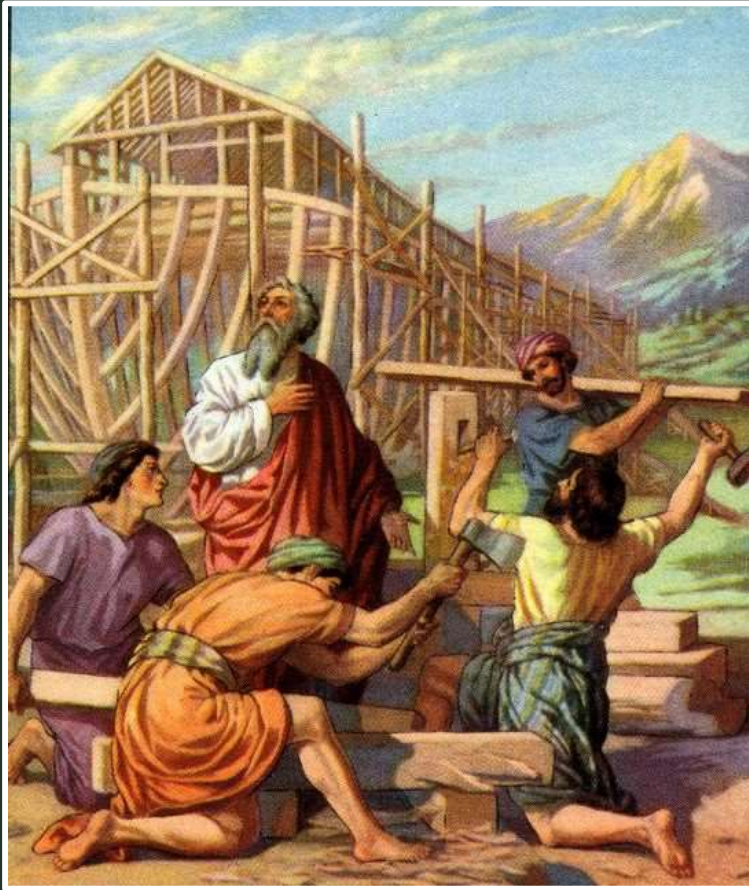
Lamech died before his father, Methuselah. Methuselah died in the same year as the Great Flood, approximately 2245 BC.

The generations of Noah and his sons are recorded in Genesis 6, 10, and 11.



Genesis 6:9-10

⁹ These *are* the generations of Noah:

Noah was a just man *and* perfect in his generations, *and* Noah walked with God.

¹⁰ And Noah begat three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth.





Genesis 10:1

- 1 Now these *are* the generations of the sons of Noah, Shem, Ham, and Japheth: and unto them were sons born after the flood.





The sons of Japheth: Genesis 10:2-5
The sons of Ham: Genesis 10:6-20
The sons of Shem: Genesis 10:21-31



Genesis 10:32

³² These *are* the families of the sons of Noah, after their generations, in their nations: and by these were the nations divided in the earth after the flood.





The generations of SHEM are particularly important because he is in the line of Christ.

(In the Gospel of Luke, Old Testament names are spelled according to their Greek form.)



Luke 3:23, 36b-38

²³ And Jesus himself began to be about thirty years of age, being (as was supposed) the son of Joseph, which was *the son* of Heli...

³⁶ ...which was *the son of Sem*, which was *the son of Noe*, which was *the son* of Lamech,

³⁷ Which was *the son* of Mathusala, which was *the son* of Enoch, which was *the son* of Jared, which was *the son* of Maleleel, which was *the son* of Cainan,

³⁸ Which was *the son* of Enos, which was *the son* of Seth, which was *the son* of Adam, which was *the son* of God.



The generations of Shem are listed in both Genesis 10 and 11:

Chapter 10 lists all of Shem's sons *including* Arphaxad and his progeny down to Peleg.

Chapter 11 lists *only* the line of Arphaxad, and continues past Peleg to Terah, the father of Abraham. Arphaxad is the most important of Shem's sons because he is in the line to Christ.
