





## 1 Kings 11:1-4

- But king Solomon loved many strange women, together with the daughter of Pharaoh, women of the Moabites, Ammonites, Edomites, Zidonians, and Hittites;
- Of the nations concerning which the LORD said unto the children of Israel, Ye shall not go in to them, neither shall they come in unto you: for surely they will turn away your heart after their gods: Solomon clave unto these in love.
- And he had seven hundred wives, princesses, and three hundred concubines: and his wives turned away his heart.
- For it came to pass, when Solomon was old, that his wives turned away his heart after other gods: and his heart was not perfect with the LORD his God, as was the heart of David his father.



## 1 Kings 11:9-11

- And the LORD was angry with Solomon, because his heart was turned from the LORD God of Israel, which had appeared unto him twice,
- <sup>10</sup> And had commanded him concerning this thing, that he should not go after other gods: but he kept not that which the LORD commanded.
- Wherefore the LORD said unto Solomon,
  Forasmuch as this is done of thee, and thou hast
  not kept my covenant and my statutes, which I
  have commanded thee, I will surely rend the
  kingdom from thee, and will give it to thy servant.


For love of David, the man after his own heart, God determined to make this change only after Solomon was dead.






## 1 Kings 11:12-13


- Notwithstanding in thy days I will not do it for David thy father's sake: but I will rend it out of the hand of thy son.
- Howbeit I will not rend away all the kingdom; but will give one tribe to thy son for David my servant's sake, and for Jerusalem's sake which I have chosen.

They were often military men, starting with Solomon's general, Jeroboam.















But even as the Judeans were being carried off into Babylon, God told Jeremiah of a NEW covenant that would restore his chosen people.


This covenant is declared in Jeremiah 31. It is the subject of the book of Hebrews.


- Behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel, and with the house of Judah:

The old covenant was the Law of Moses.








After those days, saith the LORD,

And they shall teach no more every man his neighbour, and every man his brother, saying, Know the LORD:


for they shall all know me, from the least of them unto the greatest of them, saith the LORD: for I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more.








God gave Daniel the interpretation to a dream seen by King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon:
